Greetings!

The altar guild put up the Advent wreaths around church last week and I was nearly overwhelmed by a wave of emotion-or perhaps better said, emotions.

I love the blue we recently adopted for Advent, and seeing that blue on the wreaths and pulpit hanging warmed my heart. Immediately I was reminded of Kay Carlson, who enabled us to purchase the new blue vestments in loving memory of her husband, Bob.

And yet, just a few moments later, as I lit the large Advent wreath for the first time, I felt a now familiar melancholy that often attends so many of my moments of prayer and worship. Oh, how I miss sharing those moments with all of you.

To be sure, I do believe we are still worshipping together, sharing in moments of prayer and song. But there's no denying, it's not the same. I miss your faces (even mask-covered); I miss your voices; I miss the energy and warmth and light that exudes from your mere presence.

This is an Advent like no other-the darkness seems deeper, the yearning for light seems deeper, too.

But there have been glimpses of light alreadyhave there not? Ariel's solos brightened last Sunday's worship. Every day your blog writings are my morning light. And contributions to the Giving Tree ministry flood in, suggesting that the darkness of this pandemic cannot eclipse the brilliance of your generosity.

I want to say again that our sacred stories, as well as our personal stories, reveal time after time that God's light can-- and does-- penetrate any darkness.

I feel moved to remind you of this in part because of the current season we are enduring. And, truth be told, in part because I must announce that St. Luke's will

remain closed for in-person worship throughout the month of December. The entirety of our beloved Advent and Christmas traditions will be available only online.

But, rest assured, we will continue these traditions.

On December 12 by 5:00PM we will post on line our much-loved Christmas concert. Deborah Collins has edited a video recording of the 2018 concert, and I have every expectation that it will get my toe tapping and my heart pounding as it has in year's past.

On December 24, by Noon we will post a Christmas Eve service planned especially for the children and their families. With music provided by members of the St. Cecilia choir, a dramatic reading of O Zoom All Ye Faithful, and an illustrated telling of the nativity story, I trust young and not as young alike will feel the "merry" in their Christmas worship.

And finally, again by Noon December 24 we will post a second Christmas Eve celebration, this one based upon the Christmas Lessons and Carols service of our Episcopal tradition. Like the service we typically have enjoyed the 1st Sunday after Christmas, this Lessons and Carols will include some of our favorite hymns and a handful of anthems (newly recorded) sung by choir members. But also, to these pieces, we will add my Christmas sermon because... well... I can't NOT preach on Christmas Eve, now can I?!

You'll receive email invites to these special offerings in the days before, just as you do for each of our Sunday services. So please stay tuned!

Will our remembrances and celebrations of the Nativity be as in past years? Admittedly, no. And truth be told, I expect I will feel some melancholy about that. But I also trust that I will feel great joy, too-- joy as I imagine watching, singing, praying, and celebrating "alongside" you all.

You know, it occurs to me that we just might discover something very special in this crazy time of COVID. We just might find that celebrating Christmas does not so much require Jesus to be born in to our churches. What it most requires, rather, is that we allow Jesus to be born into our hearts.

AFF is offering a study of Jim Wallis' *Christ in Crisis? Reclaiming Jesus in a Time of Fear, Hate, and Violence.* About this book it was written:

In *Christ in Crisis* Jim Wallis provides a path of spiritual healing and solidarity to help us heal the divide separating Americans today. Building on "Reclaiming Jesus"-the declaration he and other church leaders wrote in May 2018 to address America's current crisis-Wallis argues that Christians have become disconnected from Jesus and need to revisit their spiritual foundations. By pointing to eight questions Jesus asked or is asked, Wallis provides a means to measure whether we are truly aligned with the moral and spiritual foundations of our Christian faith.

"Christians have often remembered, re-discovered, and returned to their obedient discipleship of Jesus Christ-both personal and public-in times of trouble. It's called coming home," Wallis reminds us. While he addresses the dividing lines and dangers facing our nation, the religious and cultural commentator's focus isn't politics; it's faith. As he has done throughout his career, Wallis offers comfort, empathy, and a practical roadmap.
