Greetings!

I received a Christmas package from my mom and stepdad today, a week after Christmas. Mom mailed it on December 7th, but this is 2020, and so a card from my cousin in Hawaii took only five days to make it to Rhode Island but a small package from Arizona took 21 days to make a shorter journey. Inside the package were two sweet cards with some spending money, and a tiny package wrapped up tight with my name on it. Curious, I unwrapped the package to find a USB drive. My husband loaded the drive onto our computer to find neatly organized files of pictures from over the last 25 years.

I could hardly catch my breath as we opened the pictures from my high school graduation. There I was, standing with my grandpa who had traveled by train from North Carolina to New Mexico to attend my graduation. Grandpa was in the middle of chemotherapy, and he was too fragile for air flight. He and Grandma insisted they would be there, so they made the journey by train instead. We had driven a couple of hours to pick them up from the train station, and when he came down the stairs I didn't recognize him. Grandpa had always had thick, wavy, shiny hair. The chemo had taken that from him. We had no way of knowing it at the time, but less than six months later the cancer would take him from us. Those pictures from graduation carry joy and grief; I was too young and too full of...being 18 years old...to understand that it would likely be the last time I would see him. I wish I had treasured those moments more when I was in the midst of them. But that grief and regret taught me to not take for granted those moments in life that we can't get back.

A friend posted a request on Facebook today that we would share something good that happened this year. He's a Marine Corps veteran who is learning how to manage severe PTSD. He earned his JD this year and is studying for the bar exam. He is a dedicated husband and dad. He is a living example of the power of acknowledging pain and grief without becoming defined

by it. I read some of the comments his friends shared: some met educational goals, some met health goals, some are just glad that they've made it through the year. One of his friends got engaged. One opened a new business. One figured out how to make his business work even through lockdowns.

Looking at the joys his friends shared, I was reminded of something I once read: we become aware of those things to which we give our attention. If we want the world to be more beautiful, we should turn our attention to the beauty of the world. When we're aware of the world's beauty we share it with others, and the world becomes more beautiful simply because we've paid attention to what was already there. If we want the world to become more peaceful, we should give our attention to the peace in the world, and then share that peace with others. If we want to hear good news, we should do as my friend did and ask what good things are happening in the lives of those we care about.

Grief and regret can be teachers in our lives; we may not welcome them, but we can learn from them. 2020 has given us much to grieve and much to regret. I hope we can confront our grief and learn from it. I hope, too, that when you reflect on the year that is past you can also name something good that happened, something that brought you joy, something that changed for the better.

When I look for joy in this year, I don't have to look far. 2020 is the year that brought me to St. Luke's, a community full of faithful people seeking to love God and love one another. Thank you for being a source of light and hope to me in this year. I can't wait to share 2021 with you.
