#### Greetings!

I don't know about you but for me, it has been so hard to track time. I'm lucky if I know what day it is, much less the date. Which is probably why I can't believe that Palm Sunday is next week, March 28!

Although COVID has made it hard to plan too far in advance, we have been busy planning Holy Week services, and now seems like the time to share these plans with you.

As I hope you know by now, we will be resuming in-person worship this Sunday, March 21st. Both the 7:45 and 10:15 services will be held in the sanctuary.

For Palm Sunday, our schedule will be the same-7:45 and 10:15. Although we will have to forgo the usual procession with palms, palms will be placed in the pews for all who attend. (Note: If you are not attending inperson worship but would like palms, you may come to church next week, Monday through Friday, during our regular hours of 9:00-4:00, and pick up a palm in the atrium.) Palm Sunday services will be pre-recorded and posted on-line, as we have done throughout these past several months.

During Holy Week, we will celebrate the Eucharist Monday through Wednesday, beginning at 7:00PM. As has been our custom for several years now, there will be guest preachers at each of these services. I am delighted to tell you that Eddy Lopez will preach on Monday, followed by Angie Howard-McParland on Tuesday, and Paul Brookes on Wednesday.

Maundy Thursday, we will gather for a celebration of the Eucharist and stripping of the altar, again beginning at 7:00PM. Although we are not able to enjoy our usual meal that night, I have no doubt the remainder of the service will be moving and powerful for all.

#### **Stay Connected**



On Good Friday we will have two services, a noon-time service, straight from the Book of Common Prayer, followed by our beloved Taizé service (with a reduced choir) at 7:00PM. Again because of COVID, we will not be able to linger at the foot of the cross that night, but there still will be an opportunity for each of you to place a lit candle in the surrounding sand.

Our Holy Week schedule concludes with three celebrations of Easter-7:30, 9:00, and 11:00AM. The 7:30 will be without a choir but Rodney will be present to offer his fine talents. I am excited to tell you that the 9:00 will be an outdoor celebration, weather permitting, behind Swift gym, complete with (limited) choir, brass and timpani. Please bring your own chairs or blankets for this service. If it is raining, we will move back into the sanctuary. And finally, regardless of weather, we will return to the sanctuary for the 11:00 celebration, again made festive by the accompaniment of choir, brass, and timpani. For the latter two services we will have additional seating, video and sound set up in the auditorium.

If you plan to attend any or all of these services, please make sure to sign up on-line, as our seating capacity remains reduced to ensure 6 feet of separation.

And for those individuals still unable to attend inperson worship, throughout Holy Week we will be livestreaming all of our services. (Note: This is a departure from our usual pre-recorded offerings.)

Last year, when we celebrated Easter distanced from one another with no respite from COVID in sight, it felt a bit as if Lent continued despite our Christian calendar. Hope might have been on our lips but it was absent from our hearts. This year, although my heart still aches to see you all, the Easter spirit of hope better matches our country's mood. There is new life that awaits us.

And for that promise I am moved to say, "Thanks be to God."

I look forward to walking through Holy Week with you all.

### **Fully Vaccinated? Here Are Your Rules**

The CDC has unveiled guidelines for those who have been vaccinated, starting with, what qualifies for "fully vaccinated"?

According to the CDC, people are considered fully vaccinated:

- 2 weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series, like the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines, or
- 2 weeks after a single-dose vaccine, like Johnson & Johnson's Janssen vaccine

If it has been less than 2 weeks since your shot, or if you still need to get your second dose, you are NOT fully protected. Keep taking all prevention steps until you are fully vaccinated....

What wonderful news! Jesus understands. We hope you will join us as we dive more deeply into this welcome invitation. Please read Chapter 5 in preparation for our discussion.


