Greetings!

"There's often a part of our lives that we keep from God," James Martin, S.J. observes in his book Seven Last Words. It's a simple suggestion, really. Simple, but more than a little unsettling if you think about it.

I say "unsettling" because the reality is whatever parts they might be, they likely are pretty charged parts. Charged perhaps because of their personal nature- "I don't want God to know that about me!" we might feel secretly. "Besides, God doesn't care about those kinds of personal details," we can rationalize.

Or charged because of their unspoken importance- "I don't need God telling me what to do about this," we might whisper to ourselves. "Besides, this really has nothing to do with God," we can argue.

I don't know about you, but for me, the parts I might hide from God speak volumes about me. About those things for which I am embarrassed. About those things which I can barely admit to myself. About those things I want to hide from one and all. About those matters where I am not willing to relinquish control. About those decisions where I want to do my will, and my will alone. About those places where I am most self-absorbed.

And it also occurs to me, those parts that I hide from God suggest more than a little about the God I presume to worship-- and the Jesus I claim to follow. Do I believe I am one of God's beloved; or not? Do I believe God has forgiven me (and will continue to forgive me) my sins; or not? Do I believe God's Kingdom is near; or not? Do I believe that the way of Jesus has anything to do with the way I am to live my life; or not? Do I believe Jesus' death on the cross means anything for me; or not?

With our Lenten journey about to come to conclusion, I invite you to wonder along with me, "What part of my self and of my life, during these past several

weeks, have I kept from God?" To ask yourself, "Why have I done that?" And to consider sharing with God just a bit more.

You know, it's not too late to seek God's grace or to follow Jesus' ways. It's not too late to open wider that door to your heart. In fact, I suspect if we dare do, we will find God has been waiting on the other side all along.


