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#### Greetings!

Things are heating up in the St. Luke's Community Kitchen! The design and cost estimating phase of the project has been more drawn out than expected, but we are very nearly there. Construction is just within reach! But we're not *quite* there yet. Sounds a lot like the past year we've been living, doesn't it? Let me bring you up to date.

#### WHERE WE'VE BEEN

As I shared at the Annual Meeting, our first professional cost estimate came in quite high. The Kitchen Improvements Committee went to work looking for ways to simplify and trim scope while staying true to our original vision. Some of the design changes we made were:

\* We brought the kitchen back to its current size rather than expanding into the adjacent utility room.

\* We went with moveable tables instead of a fixed island in front of the serving area in the dining room (a more flexible solution anyway).

\* The built-in dining room benches will receive a fresh coat of paint instead of new wood cladding.

\* Screens to hide stacked furniture in the corners of the dining room were eliminated.

\* We went to a non-ducted commercial dishwasher and eliminated dining room air conditioning (although we are leaving in provisions for it to be added in the future).

We felt that none of these changes substantially diminished our original vision.

\* We will have a new sanitary-grade and codecomplaint kitchen with new commercial equipment and

furnishings.

\* We will have a new dining room ceiling with energy efficient light fixtures that don't emit a harsh glare.

\* We will have new dining room tables and chairs.

\* We will have a modest ceiling-mounted projector and screen for classes and presentations.

Meanwhile, our architect, Peter Lofgren, engaged a new contractor, Holdenworks, to help tighten the estimate. Peter and Mark Holden worked closely with us. They sharpened the design documentation and obtained more precise pricing from subcontractors and suppliers.

The result of this effort is a new estimate that is much lower. When you add design fees, permits, furniture, AV equipment and some contingency to the construction cost, the total comes to about \$588,000. We have raised \$513,000 to date which puts us \$75,000 (13%) short of our goal.

In the process of getting here, we wrestled some more difficult scenarios. One of them would have postponed the elevator replacement, as it is a costly item that is not essential to the upgrade of the kitchen. But it *is* essential to our vision of access and inclusion. In fact, it is the very essence of the first of our five project goals -- which are to have a facility that allows us to *embrace*, *prepare*, *serve*, *gather and learn*.

When we saw that we were within \$75,000 of being able to keep the elevator in the project, we entertained the possibility of reactivating the kitchen fundraising campaign in order to get everything done this summer. Restoring the elevator now is the just and right thing to do. It allows us to "complete the embrace" as we reach out to our neighbors with feeding ministries and other community events. It also allows us to be more inclusive in our own St. Luke's family gatherings.

The Vestry approved this plan of action this week. We will be entering into contract with Holdenworks to begin construction while we seek to raise the final 13% of the project cost.

#### WHERE WE'RE HEADED

Things are going to start happening quickly! Peter Lofgren will be submitting for building and health department permits next week. We will begin to procure long lead items such as kitchen and mechanical equipment and the elevator.

The last of the pricing will be nailed down and we will enter into contract with Holdenworks. Not only has Holdenworks been very collaborative during the design and cost estimating process, they came highly recommended by Peter Lofgren who has worked with them on past projects. Holdenworks has done work for St. Paul's in Wickford and is restoring parts of the Old Narragansett Meeting House. They have a strong working relationship with experienced subcontractors. They have been engaged in our project and are ready to begin work. If any of you have attempted to have construction work done recently, you will understand how valuable it is to have a contractor engaged and ready to go in this current market.

We hope to obtain permits and begin construction in June. The project should take about 8 weeks to complete and be finished in early September.

#### HOW WE'LL GET THERE

In addition to the incredibly generous \$300,000 gift from Al and Linda Potter, 55 of you pledged an amazing \$123,000. Thank you so much for your generosity. Additionally, \$28,000 from the golf tournament, \$18,000 in grants, and other funding sources increased our tally. And recently, our three major food ministries allocated their \$5,000 portion of the Easter offering to the kitchen renovation. Their program expenditures have been low due to COVID-19 suspensions, and supporting the kitchen renovation underpins everything they do.

But we still have \$75,000 to raise to make the dream of our new kitchen come true. Two initiatives are underway to help close this gap:

\* On May 22, 2021, St. Luke's is participating in the Hill and Harbour Yard Sale. We will use this as an opportunity to share the story of our feeding ministries with our neighbors. We will distribute an information flyer with a QR code and will set up a donation box.

\* We have applied for a Resource Fund grant from the Episcopal Diocese of Rhode Island and expect to hear back next week.

But we are not going to reach our goal without additional support from our parishioners. The pledge campaign started out strong last year, but because of the disruptions of COVID-19, we never had the focused close to the effort that we planned. Many of you have shared that you had intended to give but just got sidetracked (and understandably so!) by all that went on last year.

So, we will be sending out new pledge cards to those who have not yet donated to the kitchen campaign. We are hoping that we can receive 100% participation and demonstrate a solidarity of support for our feeding ministries and community outreach.

I continue to be amazed, time and again, by the generosity and deep faith of our St. Luke's family. Thank you for being part of this ambitious project. We are going to have a beautiful new kitchen and dining room this fall. And those with mobility issues will be able to reach our events with greater ease and dignity. Thank you for helping us complete the embrace, as we seek to reach out to be good neighbors and serve one another.

#### **Covid Vaccine Update**

#### **Rhode Island COVID-19 Vaccination Update**

Governor Dan McKee and the Rhode Island Department of Health (RIDOH) are writing to provide an update on Rhode Island's COVID-19 vaccine efforts. As of this afternoon, 547,248 people have received one dose of vaccine and 381,996 people are now fully vaccinated.

We are now seventh in the country for the number of people who have received at least one dose and seventh the country for the number of people fully vaccinated. We are also third in the country for vaccinating people age 65 and older.

As of Thursday, 63% of Rhode Islanders have received at least one dose of vaccine and 43% of the population is fully vaccinated. This is remarkable progress from where we started in early February to now; it is all thanks to you.

Everyone should get vaccinated. Every shot in the arm gets us all closer to fireworks, parades, and summer celebrations with our families and friends.

**No Appointments Needed** - We are working to make vaccination as easy, convenient, and accessible as possible. Resources needed to book an appointment should not be a barrier to getting vaccinated. If you want to get vaccinated at one of the State-run sites, making an appointment in advance at <u>www.vaccinateRI.org</u> is still the best way to go, but starting Thursday, April 29, appointments are no longer needed to get vaccinated at three State-run sites:

- 100 Sockanosset Cross Road, Cranston, which is open Tuesday through Saturday from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. Parking is available behind the building.
- Dunkin' Donuts Center, 1 La Salle Square, Providence, which is open Tuesday through Saturday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Three hours of free parking are available in North Garage at 114 West Exchange St. Accessible parking is available in front of the Dunkin' Donuts Center. Volunteers are available to direct people to the clinic.
- 1400 West Main Road, Middletown, which is open Wednesday through Sunday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Also, beginning Thursday, April 29, appointments will no longer be needed to get vaccinated at 80 select CVS, Walgreens, Walmart, and Stop & Shop pharmacy locations throughout the state.
