Greetings!

We're in the thick of it down in the kitchen and dining room! Construction is moving along and lots of different pieces are being worked on and coordinated.

Electrical rough-in is in full swing. The main electrical panel boxes have been set and primary conduit is being installed that will connect to the new 3-phase electrical service National Grid is bringing in from the street. Junction boxes for new outlets, appliances and equipment are being installed throughout the kitchen and dining room. And wiring is being run to power new light fixtures.

Plumbing rough-in has begun too. A concrete scan of the kitchen floor revealed that there is a wide field of electrical conduit embedded in the slab. Subsequently, our plumbing subcontractor scoped out the existing under-slab drain pipes with a small camera and determined that they are in good condition. So fortunately, we will be able to tie the new kitchen plumbing fixtures into the existing under-slab drains and avoid any conflict with saw cutting and trenching of the slab.

To accommodate future installation of air conditioning, we are installing ductwork, condensate drain piping, empty PVC conduit and access panels above areas of new drywall ceiling in the dining room. Installation of this infrastructure now will allow the AC system to be installed in the future without having to disturb the drywall.

Some boarding of soffits and walls has begun -the rest awaits completion of electrical and plumbing
rough-in. The contractor expects to be able to have
building department rough-in inspections in a couple of
weeks.

The concrete block dining room walls between the windows have been faced with new drywall and the

wall heater covers adjusted to attach cleanly to the face of the new finish. We will be boxing out the base under the heaters to conceal existing conduit that runs beneath the benches.

The pull-down kitchen counter pass-through windows have been fabricated and will be installed next week. We have enough in the budget to replace the exterior doors that open out under the loggia with ones that will be wide enough to accommodate a wheelchair. We will also be facing the lower half of the windows on either side of the doors with translucent film to block the view of the recycling bins outside.

The elevator equipment arrives next week and installation will begin then. Preparation work inside the elevator shaft has already begun.

As is common across the construction industry these days, we are experiencing significant supply-chain delays. I have just learned that the cabinetry will not be delivered until late September. Hopefully that is the outlier, but our architect and contractor have been unable to get firm delivery dates for other major pieces of equipment and material. This despite persistent efforts. Everyone (including me) wants to know when the project will be complete, but it is not possible to set a firm date until we get some of these delivery dates confirmed. At this time, however, it looks like the project will not be fully complete before early to mid-October. I will keep you posted.

Kind of a dry, matter-of-fact report this time. But in this crazy up and down time we are living in, dry, matter-of-fact is nice for a change. I end this update, as always, with such a huge thanks for the generosity and support of all of you who are making this project possible. Each of you is a partner in bringing this project into being. Your financial contribution and your shared dedication to the vision of what this kitchen means to our church, our outreach, and our community are just as essential as every board laid and every nail hammered. Thank you for being on this journey with us together! More updates to come!

Please join us for Adult Faith Formation Wednesday, August 18th, from 7:00 - 9:00 pm as we watch *Traces of the Trade* together in the church sanctuary. Following the movie, we'll have the opportunity for shared reflection facilitated by Michelle Jones, Director of Equity and Belonging at Rocky Hill Country Day School. From the film's synopsis:

"In *Traces of the Trade*, Producer/Director Katrina Browne tells the story of her forefathers, the largest slave-trading family in U.S. history...The film follows Browne and nine fellow family members on a remarkable journey which brings them face-to-face with the history and legacy of New England's hidden enterprise...The issues the DeWolf descendants are confronted with dramatize questions that apply to the nation as a whole: What, concretely, is the legacy of slavery-for diverse whites, for diverse blacks, for diverse others? Who owes who what for the sins of the fathers of this country? What history do we inherit as individuals and as citizens? How does Northern complicity change the equation? What would repair-spiritual and material-really look like and what would it take?"

We hope that you will join us as we learn and reflect together on these important questions.


