This week is Kickoff Sunday! I can hardly believe it. Last year at this time, we had a sort-of kind-of kickoff, but everyone kept telling me that I was missing the essence of what a real start to the program year feels like at St. Luke's. And they were right! The pandemic has altered everyone's sense of "normal". We continue to abide by the best practices suggested by the CDC and RIDOH, but even still the energy around the church this year is very different than it was last year. Masks are mandated when inside and optional for vaccinated folks when outside, but we can be inside together! And though we are masked, the congregation can sing! Youth Faith Formation begins next Sunday, September 19th, (registration will be available in the atrium Sunday, or you can fill out this form), and Adult Faith Formation resumes via Zoom on Wednesday, September 15th! Rodney is working on plans for our choirs- and what an amazing joy it has been to hear our choristers sing! Last year there were times I'd enter the church and the space itself felt lonely, like it was anticipating people who could not come. This year the church feels like it's brimming with energy and hope, as though the church itself is eager for us to gather together again. I'm so glad to be here, so glad to get to celebrate our kickoff together, so glad for the good work being done with good people who care for one another.

There are so many ways to be involved at St. Luke's, and beginning this week Sundays in September will feature some of them during coffee hour following the services. One of the loveliest ministries at St. Luke's is our Godly Play youth formation for kids who are pre-K through 5th grades. As Theresa Deiters Muscat writes below, "Godly play assumes that children have some experience of the mystery of the presence of God in their lives, but they sometimes lack the language, permission and understanding to express and enjoy this in our culture. In this room during Godly Play we encourage each child to express their understanding, their experience, and their response to God's presence in their lives." Godly Play is truly one of the most wonderful ways our children can grow in their faith, and I am delighted to share Theresa's introduction to it below. 3-5 meet from 9:30 to 10:05 and pre-k through 2 meet promptly from 10:10, the children then join their parents in the church at the Peace.

Godly Play is part of the wonderful and unique curriculum that Youth Faith Formation offers here at St. Luke's. St Luke's has invested in this program for children who are in pre-k though 5th grades.

Each Sunday the children meet in the very unique and special environment we call the Godly Play Room. In the Godly Play Room the children meet with two guides, their storyteller and their greeter. Everything in this room was designed and made especially for children. They sit in community (a circle) on the floor and are treated to a parable, silence, scared stories, and sacred liturgy in order to discover God, themselves, one another and the world around them.

Godly play assumes that children have some experience of the mystery of the presence of God in their lives, but they sometimes lack the language, permission and understanding to express and enjoy this in our culture. In this room during Godly Play we encourage each child to express their understanding, their experience, and their response to God's presence in their lives. They are encouraged to WONDER.....

What is Godly Play? Godly Play is what Jerome Berryman calls his interpretation of Montessori religious education. It is an imaginative approach to working with children, an approach that supports, challenges, nourishes and guides their spiritual quest.

The children enter the space after being individually greeted by name. They choose a carpet square or the much coveted puffs and find their place in the circle. They then get ready for the presentation. A candle is lit and a prayer is offered. The presentation often coincides with what is happening in church. We try as best as we can to follow the liturgical calendar. After the presentation, they are invited to respond and share their **wonderings**. Then they then get to choose what they want to work with in the room. The desert box is a fan favorite. Everything in the space is for them...art supplies, books, and a year's worth of lesson materials. We end with sharing a feast and a prayer.





Online Banking

Bill Pay — with online bill pay, you add St. Luke's Church as a payee, enter our address of 99 Peirce St. East Greenwich, RI 02818 and schedule your payment.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use online bill pay, then you are familiar with making payments this way. You can schedule single payments, or set up regular payments in advance.

Zelle Transfer

Zelle Payment — with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the giving@stlukeseg.org address.

Benefits: Ease of use — if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you have to initiate

VANCO Payment Solutions

VANCO Payments – With VANCO payments, you create your individual account on the VANCO site, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's account

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then this is your site! VANCO is the only option that accepts credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments

Transaction Fees for the Church

Direct Payment From IRA

Direct Transfer – If you are 70 % or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA. Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

Corporate Communion

Children understand the symbolism and significance of the Eucharist in ways that are often surprising and delightful. It is no wonder that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me!" Since the 1979 *Prayerbook*, our church has lived into the theology that Baptism is full initiation into the Body of Christ, moving away from the idea that Confirmation and "understanding" are the benchmarks for participation in the Eucharist. The book we use is an *instruction not preparation* book. It offers age-appropriate theology, liturgy, and tradition to children.

The Corporate Communion program at St. Luke's is offered each Spring. It is generally for children in the 3 or 4 grade. It is a 6 week class that takes place on Sunday's, from 9:30-10:10. CC culminates with a celebration on the last Sunday at the 10:15 service. The instructor, Erica Simo has taught the program for many years. She is kind, insightful and faithful. The children are given an instruction book called This Bread and This Cup, a personal journal and a beautiful gift is presented to them on the last Sunday of the program.

Our children are not the future of the church, they are the church of today. If you are interested in signing up for this program for the Spring of 2022, please feel free to reach out to me. I would be happy to answer any questions you may have and add your child's name to the class list.


