Greetings!

Last Sunday, Kick-off Sunday, was such a joy for me!

It was a joy seeing many of you for the first time in weeks if not months. It was a joy hearing the sounds of our youngest members both in the sanctuary and in our halls. It was a joy having worship enhanced by the return of our choirs.

Even though we still are wearing our masks indoors—my great thanks to all of you who have been so respectful about this mitigation effort—last Sunday felt to me like another step in the direction of a return to the fullness of our corporate life.

Admittedly though, with the Delta variant so contagious, we are not done with having to manage COVID-related concerns. Nationally, medical experts continue to research questions regarding the safety of vaccines for the under-12 population, as well as the emerging question of a booster vaccine for those of us already vaccinated. (Even though their findings and recommendations occasionally change, I, for one, am grateful for their efforts in helping us all navigate these unchartered waters.)

Likewise, locally, as we yearn to resume beloved ministries and experiences, we must continue to reflect upon the wisdom of our practices and the ways we might mitigate risks. (I use the language of "mitigate risks" because there is no way to 100% guarantee that the COVID virus won't make its way through our doors.)

Now, let me name something felt in my house, which perhaps captures a sentiment shared more widely: I am tired of this darn COVID! How about you? But truth be told, COVID does not care about our feelings of fatigue. It remains as committed as ever to spreading from one person to another. Which is why your leadership here at St. Luke's and I remain as committed as ever to crafting thoughtful and reasonable protocols for our shared life.

Below, you will find a document which spells out not only the latest protocols but also a series of assumptions and expectations. I ask you to read them at your leisure—but please do read them.

Over the past year and a half, the national conversations regarding COVID have been framed in a variety of ways ranging from political to economic to scientific. I suppose there's no denying that all of these perspectives have influenced policy and practices. But as I have said any number of times regarding any number of issues, I believe our calling as Christians requires that we also engage our challenges

COVID-19 PROTOCOLS - SEPTEMBER 2021

The following document is intended to provide an outline of our latest COVID-related protocols, as well as attending assumptions and expectations. While not exhaustive in terms of identifying all situations and questions, it should give you a sense of our general "playbook." These protocols are intended for any and all activities held on the St. Luke's campus, regardless whether church or rental activities. (This document will be shared with "outside renters" and the expectation is that they will be responsible for implantation and compliance.)

My great thanks, as always, for the contributions of our COVID Steering Committee, whose expertise, wisdom and considerations continue to guide us.

General COVID Protocols Intended to Mitigate Risk of Transmission

- 1. No one should enter the buildings or attend St. Luke's events if experiencing any of the symptoms related to COVID.
- 2. All definitions and requirements regarding "close contacts" according to the RI Department of Health should be followed. (Note: See definition and requirements of "close contact" below.)
- 3. For all church-related meetings, rehearsals, classes, and worship held indoors it is expected that masks will be worn regardless of vaccination status.
- 4. If meetings, rehearsals, classes, and worship take place outdoors, masks remain required for unvaccinated and are optional for vaccinated.
- 5. Every attempt to maximize ventilation and air quality will be made for classes, rehearsals, meetings, and worship.
- 6. When possible, classes and rehearsals will take advantage of outdoor spaces.
- 7. Contact Tracing Records will be kept for two weeks for all St. Luke's activities. Those committee and ministry leaders running meetings should make note of attendance and within 24 hours provide the office with such information.
- 8. If an individual has attended a St. Luke activity and tests positive for COVID within 48 hours of attendance, then she/he must inform either Christina, Tim, Tanya, Rodney, or Theresa.

Additional Program-specific Protocols

Youth Faith Formation and Nursery

1. Godly Play Advance sign-up is requested (but not required) for attendance. Sign-up is available at our website. Consistent with our general policy, all students will be required to wear masks while indoors. For the foreseeable future, both the 9:30 and 10:10 classes will meet in the upper auditorium to maximize social distancing. Whenever possible, after the storytelling component, the

class will move outside for reflection time and snacks (prepared for each individual child). Classes will be limited to no more than 12 children.

- 2. All other classes will be held either in our largest available indoor spaces or outside.
- 3. The nursery will be open for children under the age of 3. Again, advance sign-up is requested (but not required) for attendance. Sign-up is available at our website. There is a limit of no more than 6 households to be represented in the nursery. Snacks will be offered in cups and distributed by the nursery attendants only. Play-things will be closely monitored and not shared between children. They will be cleaned between each session. Masks will not be required for nursery-age children. Masks and vaccinations will be required for all nursery attendants, both paid and volunteer.

Choirs

- 1. Choir rehearsals for youth will be outside when possible and reasonable, and, when inside, in a socially distanced space.
- 2. When rehearsals for any of the choirs are inside, masks will be required regardless of vaccination status.
- 3. For any of the choirs, when rehearsals are outside, masks are optional for vaccinated individuals and required for unvaccinated persons.
- 4. During worship all choirs will be expected to wear masks.

Important Definitions, Expectations, and Understanding

- 1. Close contact is defined as anyone who is within 6 feet of an infected person for a cumulative 15 minutes over a 24 hour period (regardless of vaccination status or masking).
- 2. It is expected by the Department of Health that if one is designated a "close contact" and vaccinated, then she/he need not quarantine but should take a PCR test immediately and 5 days after contact.
- 3. It is expected by the Department of Health that if one is designated a "close contact" and unvaccinated, then she/he is to quarantine for 7 days, get a PCR test at day 5, and remain in quarantine until day 8, at which time, if without symptoms, she/he may return to church-related activities.
- 4. It is our pledge that we will do all that we can at St. Luke's to mitigate risks and provide households with thorough, clear, and timely information.
- 5. It is our expectation that should an adult or youth test positive for COVID within 48 hours of attending an event at St. Luke's, the office will be notified immediately. The office will then share this information with those who have been "close contacts" (without disclosing the name of the "positive" person)
- 6. It is our expectation that each household will honor these protocols as a minimum mitigation and management standard, and then make whatever additional decisions seem best for each individual member.
- 7. These protocols are based upon the following critical understandings:
- A. Vaccinations are highly effective at preventing <u>serious illness</u> requiring hospitalization.
- B. Unvaccinated children (12 and under) without additional health concerns are less likely to experience serious illness requiring hospitalization than adult counterparts.
- C. Nursery aged children are less likely to spread the virus amongst one another than adult and teen counterparts.
- D. Masks (especially those such as a KN95 variety) help mitigate the risk of transmission.

Online Banking

Bill Pay — with online bill pay, you add St. Luke's Church as a payee, enter our address of 99 Peirce St. East Greenwich, RI 02818 and schedule your payment.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use online bill pay, then you are familiar with making payments this way. You can schedule single payments, or set up regular payments in advance.

No cost to you or the Church.

Zelle Transfer

Zelle Payment — with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the giving@stlukeseg.org address.

Benefits: Ease of use — if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you have to initiate each payment.

No cost to you or the Church

VANCO Payment Solutions

VANCO Payments – With VANCO payments, you create your individual account on the VANCO site, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's account

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then this is your site! VANCO is the only option that accepts credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments

Transaction Fees for the Church

Direct Payment From IRA

Direct Transfer – If you are 70 ½ or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA. Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

Corporate Communion

Children understand the symbolism and significance of the Eucharist in ways that are often surprising and delightful. It is no wonder that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me!" Since the 1979 *Prayerbook*, our church has lived into the theology that Baptism is full initiation into the Body of Christ, moving away from the idea that Confirmation and "understanding" are the benchmarks for participation in the Eucharist. The book we use is an *instruction not preparation* book. It offers age-appropriate theology, liturgy, and tradition to children.

The Corporate Communion program at St. Luke's is offered each Spring. It is generally for children in the 3 or 4 grade. It is a 6 week class that takes place on Sunday's, from 9:30-10:10. CC culminates with a celebration on the last Sunday at the 10:15 service. The instructor, Erica Simo has taught the program for many years. She is kind, insightful and faithful. The children are given an instruction book called This Bread and This Cup, a personal journal and a beautiful gift is presented to them on the last Sunday of the program.
