Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Lately I've been thinking a lot about time. For some people, time is very concrete. My husband is one of those people- he's always ten minutes early wherever he goes, he has a sense of how to wrap up conversations in time to move to his next meeting, he has a schedule and keeps to it. For some people, time is a little more amorphous. I'm one of those people- I get absorbed by tasks or conversations and lose track of time. I have to double the time I think it will take me to get something done or get to a meeting, otherwise I'm going to be late. I've learned to appreciate people like my husband, people I can trust to keep things on track. And he's learned to appreciate that I am present in the moment, often picking up on things that might slip by him because I don't have a clock ticking in the background of my mind.

The Greeks describe time in two ways: Chronos and Kairos. Chronological comes from Chronos; the linear, sequential marking of time, the days and weeks that make up our lives. Kairos has a spiritual dimension, a sense of time outside of the ordinary pattern of our days. We might consider Kairos described in the familiar passage from Ecclesiastes: "There is a time for everything, and a season for everything under the heavens." We need both Chronos and Kairos; we make sense of our lives in the days and years that go by, but our lives are given meaning by Kairos, a sense of the holy and transcendent that is possible in each moment.

As we near Holy Week, I am mindful that we are invited into a both/and sense of time, a Chronos and Kairos way of being as we remember the final days in the life of Jesus. The concrete and the amorphous coexist. We can mark the days on the calendar and anticipate them. We will have services on Palm Sunday at our traditional times in the morning: 7:45 and 10:15. We will have services each evening of the week at 7:00, except for Maundy Thursday, which will begin at 6:00. On Good Friday we will have a 12:00 service from the Book of Common Prayer and a 7:00 Taizé service. The chronological calendar is set, and each service gives us an opportunity to engage more deeply with our faith.

The chronological calendar is set, and yet it is incomplete if we are not attuned to the spiritual dimension of the time we share together. The past and present collide in our Holy Week observances, where we remember the stories of our faith together and imagine how they speak to us in our present moment. There is a deep Kairos undercurrent to the calendar that compels us to be present to the joy of being with Jesus; the servanthood of our Messiah who washed the feet of his disciples and then told them to do the same; the obedience Jesus shows as the creator submits to the cruelty of the created; the

loneliness and betrayal Jesus experienced when he was abandoned by those he loved; the incalculable mercy of the savior who forgave even as he was being brutally crucified; and finally the exultation and rejoicing in Jesus' resurrection. If we are present to the chronological journey in the week, our Holy Week, the joy of our coming celebration will resonate more deeply because we will also have been present to the spiritual journey.

I look forward to sharing Holy Week with you, of being attentive to how Chronos and Kairos move together in our observances, of how the Spirit continues to speak across time and impels us to be faithful to God-with-us.




First quarter has come to a close – I'd like to join the leadership team in thanking all of you. Your continued love of this Parish is always amazing!

Online Banking

Bill Pay – with online bill pay, you add St. Luke's Church as a payee, enter our address of 99 Peirce St. East Greenwich, RI 02818 and schedule your payment.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use online bill pay, then you are familiar with making payments this way. You can schedule single payments, or set up regular payments in advance.

No cost to you or the Church.

Zelle Transfer

Zelle Payment – with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the giving@stlukeseg.org address.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you have to initiate each payment.

No cost to you or the Church

VANCO Payment Solutions

VANCO Payments – With VANCO payments, you create your individual account on the VANCO site, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's account

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then this is your site! VANCO is the only option that accepts credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments

Transaction Fees for the Church

Direct Payment From IRA

Direct Transfer – If you are 70 ½ or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA.

Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

"Jesus came preaching, but the church wound up preaching Jesus. Why does the church insist on making Jesus the *object* of its attention rather than heeding his *message*? (The late) Harvard minister, Peter J. Gomes, believes that excessive focus on the Bible and doctrines about Jesus have

led the Christian church astray. To recover the transformative power of the gospel Gomes says we must go beyond the Bible and rediscover how to live out Jesus' original revolutionary message of hope. "

(Gomes writes,) "... *Hope is not merely the optimistic view that somehow everything will turn out all right in the end if everyone just does as we do. Hope is the more rugged, the more muscular view that even if things don't turn out all right and aren't all right, we endure through and beyond the times that disappoint or threaten to destroy us.*"

This Lent, I hope you'll join me and others in reading Peter Gomes' *The Scandalous Gospel*. Please read Chapter 6 in preparation for our next class.
