Dear Brothers and Sisters,

There is nothing more meaningful to me than our weekly celebration of the Eucharist. To my understanding, the Eucharist is that experience where God gathers all of God's beloved around the table. It reflects God's unwavering love for us. It captures God's great desire to feed and sustain us for the week which is to come.

All of which is why I am so passionate when I say, "All of you are welcome at the Lord's table."

It's also why I so delight in our "Corporate Communion" celebrations.

For those of you not familiar with these occasions, you should know first that it is our practice at St. Luke's to offer communion to any person—no age or certification required. Just as we begin providing foods to our infant children without their full understanding of the nutritional benefits to their physical health, I believe it appropriate to do the same as it relates to their spiritual health. I also think it important that they never feel turned away from God's family supper. (You should see the eager faces of our youth as they come to the communion rail, and the disappointment for many of them when they are not allowed to receive.) And perhaps most importantly, I have always thought receiving communion is more a matter of the heart than the head, regardless of age.

So, while I certainly respect the different choices parents make regarding when their children might receive communion, I want to be clear, I am happy to share the Eucharist with any child as soon as she/he is able to swallow it!

But all of that said, our corporate communion classes invite 3rd and 4th graders into an intentional time of study and reflection regarding the experience of receiving communion. Research on the stages of faith development suggests that this age provides a perfect time for children both to understand more deeply the meaning of communion and also to appreciate more fully the mystery of our sacramental beliefs. Possessing an amazing capacity for wonder, their imaginings about how Jesus' "real presence" is found in our Eucharist (the Episcopal Church's theology of the Eucharist, in case you didn't know) never ceases to amaze me! Often after meeting with the kids, I think, maybe we should have a similar class for adults too—and let the children present!

Finally, in recognition of the conversations they've shared, we hold a "Corporate Communion Sunday" where the children are invited to stand with me at the altar table as we celebrate the Eucharist. It really

is one of my favorite moments of the year, their eyes wide-opened, filled with excitement and pride.

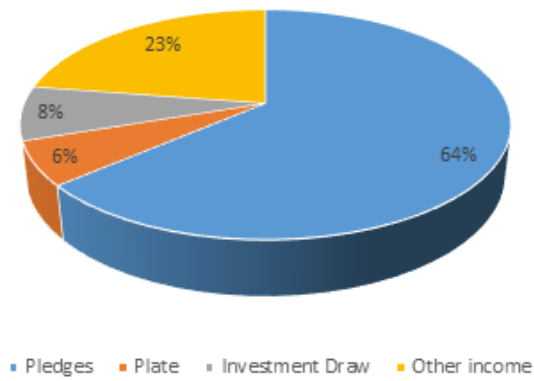

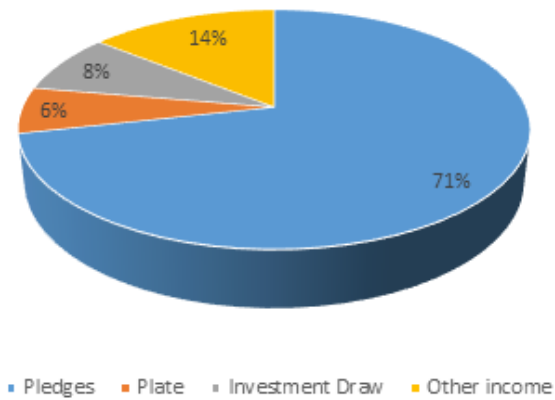
First quarter has come to a close – I'd like to join the leadership team in thanking all of you. Your continued love of this Parish is always amazing!

"Jesus came preaching, but the church wound up preaching Jesus. Why does the church insist on making Jesus the *object* of its attention rather than heeding his *message*? (The late) Harvard minister, Peter J. Gomes, believes that excessive focus on the Bible and doctrines about Jesus have led the Christian church astray. To recover the transformative power of the gospel Gomes says we must go beyond the Bible and rediscover how to live out Jesus' original revolutionary message of hope."

(Gomes writes,) "... *Hope is not merely the optimistic view that somehow everything will turn out all right in the end if everyone just does as we do. Hope is the more rugged, the more muscular view that even if things don't turn out all right and aren't all right, we endure through and beyond the times that disappoint or threaten to destroy us.*"

As we journey through Easter, I hope you'll join me and others in continuing to read Peter Gomes' The Scandalous Gospel. Please read Chapter 8 in preparation for our next class.

Women of Grace – May Meeting

Our next meeting is set for Monday, May 16 -- please mark your calendars! If you are a fan of Anne Lamott's books, you will enjoy this next session. Laura Sullivan will lead us in a discussion of Lamott's *Dusk, Night, Dawn: On Revival and Courage*. Many of us know of this author and her previous works, including the best-selling *Help, Thanks, Wow; Grace (Eventually): Thoughts on Faith*; and *Almost Everything: Notes on Hope; Hallelujah Anyway*. Known for her pragmatic perspective, plucky faith, and pithy questions, Lamott encourages us to see the Grace within the challenge, affirm ourselves, and maintain a prayerful perspective. If you are inclined to read the book before our meeting, *Dusk, Night, Dawn* is a fairly short read (208 pages) and is available on Amazon.com or ThriftBooks at <https://www.thriftbooks.com/>

Loaves and Fishes Run

In March we had a strategy session with Father Tim to brainstorm ideas on how we could carry out our mission during the time when the traditional food truck run to Woonsocket was on hold. The reason for the hold was not having people to serve because the State offered shelter and food to the homeless during the pandemic. The State's homeless support was scheduled to end on March 31st but has been extended to June 30th. Our planning session concluded by stating that we would continue to support the people at the East Greenwich Hotel with twenty sandwich bags per week. We also will continue with the Women's Shelter in Woonsocket as well as Dorcas by providing for the refugees they support.

For our run on April 30, 2022, Father Tim has asked that the current confirmation class assemble and deliver the contents for the bag lunches for the East Greenwich Hotel. The items needed per bag are detailed on the SignUp Genius.

Our friends at the Woonsocket Women's Shelter have asked if we might be able to provide window fans to help keep rooms cooler in the upcoming months. New or gently used window fans can be dropped off at the St. Luke's atrium. We hope to deliver twenty fans by the end of April or beginning of May. A suggested fan is a Penguin 9" twin window fan available locally or online for approximately \$40.00.



Dorcas, www.diiri.org, has asked if we could assist in helping with the Afghanistan relocations in the Providence area. They could use men's and women's toiletries, cleaning products, summer clothing for children, men and women, including sneakers and flip flops. Further details are on the SignUp Genius. We will continue to host in the atrium until our kitchen is ready. Our sexton makes the urn of coffee in the morning. The host provides juice, creamer for the coffee (although powdered coffee creamer is available in a pinch), and some baked goods of some sort. All supplies like cups, napkins, sugar, utensils are all located in the cupboard in the Blackburn Room. There are a few platters you can use to put goodies on. A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality - welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart.
