Dear Brothers and Sisters,

When I began at St. Luke's in the summer of 2020, I remember being surprised as I overheard bits of conversation about the planning for the first golf tournament. It was an important fundraising effort for the renovation of the church kitchen, but what I heard was not the numbers or frantic efforts at making things come together. Instead, I heard about how strongly people felt the movement of the Holy Spirit in their work, how they had grown in love and respect for one another through their shared efforts. I was deeply touched by how unique this was- how the underlying feeling was not a sense of anxiety, but a true sense of agape, that unconditional, aspirational love to which we are called in Christian community. It is that love that calls us to our best selves and seeks the best for one another.

Had I known the people of St. Luke's any better, I would not have been surprised. That sense of love, appreciation, and care for one another is part of the fabric of our community. I've seen it in the kitchen renovation, I saw it in the first golf tournament. I've seen it in the care taken with our new livestream setup. I've seen it in our feeding ministry, and with our ushers on Sunday mornings, and with the work of our altar guild. I've seen it in our faith formation classes, from Godly Play all the way through our Adult Faith Formation class. I've seen it in the beautification of our grounds. We hear it each Sunday in the voices of our choir. There are so many people who serve our community in so many ways. The spirit of agape is alive at St. Luke's.

I saw that spirit again on Monday, with our second golf tournament, auction, and dinner. There were so many moving pieces, so many things to keep track of, and this was such an incredibly important part of our fundraising efforts to improve our community spaces. The labor was intensive, but it was a labor of love. Once again, I heard from people about how their relationships with one another became deeper through the work they shared together, and how much they appreciated each other. I heard joy and delight in how people who barely knew each other became friends as they coordinated their efforts to produce a wonderful event. People contributed out of love for our community, and the joy that was evident at the event was a continuation of that love.

And...it was a truly wonderful event! The wind was intense and made the golf course pretty tricky, but people were in good spirits as they came in for the day. People mingled together around the items up for silent auction, they enjoyed visiting and catching up with each other. Dinner was delicious and the company around the tables was wonderful. We got a glimpse of the hula dancing skills of *The Three Amigos*, and Father Tim's turn as our live auctioneer was memorable

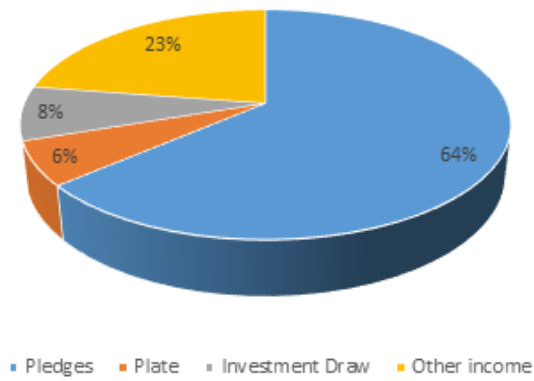
- o Utilities up \$3,756
- o Property – new repairs for heating in auditorium of \$3,600 uncovered more work of almost \$10,000 that will be needed
- o Fire panel replacement will be \$2,200
- o Parking lot sealing/stripping has been put on hold
- o At this point the expected property cost will be around \$3,800 over budget for the year, along with utility overages

Overall, we're still ahead of the budget bottom line by \$15,052. Hard to say if the economy is affecting our income – we are definitely seeing it hit our expenses, though.

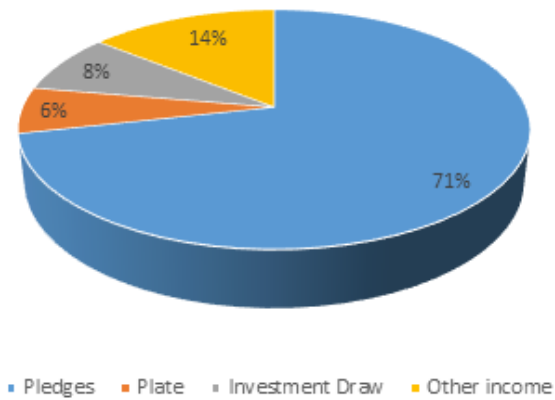
If you take off the \$65,000 in PPP money from last year's income, we would be roughly \$10,000 ahead of last year. But we were also closed last year until mid-March, and operated at a somewhat reduced capacity after that. So all that means is the pandemic is making any meaningful analysis somewhat difficult.

### Adult Faith Formation Book Study

"Jesus came preaching, but the church wound up preaching Jesus. Why does the church insist on making Jesus the *object* of its attention rather than heeding his *message*? (The late) Harvard minister, Peter J. Gomes, believes that excessive focus on the Bible and doctrines about Jesus have led the Christian church astray. To recover the transformative power of the gospel Gomes says we must go beyond the Bible and rediscover how to live out Jesus' original revolutionary message of hope."

(Gomes writes,) "... *Hope is not merely the optimistic view that somehow everything will turn out all right in the end if everyone just does as we do. Hope is the more rugged, the more muscular view that even if things don't turn out all right and aren't all right, we endure through and beyond the times that disappoint or threaten to destroy us.*"

## Women of Grace – May Meeting

Our next meeting is set for Monday, May 16 -- please mark your calendars! If you are a fan of Anne Lamott's books, you will enjoy this next session. Laura Sullivan will lead us in a discussion of Lamott's *Dusk, Night, Dawn: On Revival and Courage*. Many of us know of this author and her previous works, including the best-selling *Help, Thanks, Wow; Grace (Eventually): Thoughts on Faith*; and *Almost Everything: Notes on Hope; Hallelujah Anyway*. Known for her pragmatic perspective, plucky faith, and pithy questions, Lamott encourages us to see the Grace within the challenge, affirm ourselves, and maintain a prayerful perspective. If you are inclined to read the book before our meeting, *Dusk, Night, Dawn* is a fairly short read (208 pages) and is available on Amazon.com or ThriftBooks at <https://www.thriftbooks.com/>

The host provides juice, creamer for the coffee (although powdered coffee creamer is available in a pinch), and some baked goods of some sort. All supplies like cups, napkins, sugar, utensils are all located in the cupboard in the Blackburn Room. There are a few platters you can use to put goodies on. A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality - welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart.
