Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This Saturday at 11:00 we will celebrate the life of Pam Kelly. Pam and her husband, Dick, were active members at St. Luke's before moving to Charleston, SC, a little over a year ago. And while I will have plenty to say about Pam's big heart and deep faith this weekend, it occurs to me that the fact that Dick has asked us to celebrate her life here at St. Luke's speaks volumes about the heart and faith of this church as well.

St. Luke's offers such a wonderful opportunity for belonging and connection. Besides sharing in the faith journey, we enjoy a culture which celebrates blessings and struggles with equal heart. I know Pam and Dick contributed significantly to this culture and I imagine it a large reason why Dick is returning to memorialize his wife.

People often say to me (especially during summers in RI), I find God at the beach. Or, I find God when I am walking through the woods. And most definitely, I do too.

But what we can't find as we are walking through the woods or sitting on the beach are companions who will walk with us in our wanderings, sit with us in our pains, and dance with us in our joys. I believe that can be found only in a community of faith like St. Luke's Church.

Frankly, the forging of those bonds doesn't take that much. It takes a bit of work, to be sure. But mostly it just requires showing up, being open to the words of one another and open to the whispers of the Holy Spirit.

Thinking about all that Pam and Dick contributed to St. Luke's, let me suggest this: take some time to consider at least one small way in which, come September, you might participate in these ministries.

And then, make time to show up. If you do, I promise, the rewards won't just be in heaven. You will find them here too, amongst your friends and your family at St. Luke's.

Pam's service will be a celebration of faith, courage, and love, and I feel so privileged to preside at it. It will also be a wonderful reminder of the bonds that we forge here, at St. Luke's.

I hope I'll see you this weekend. I hope I'll see you in the weekends to come. And I hope that as we show up, not only our bonds with one another will be strengthened, but so too will that bond we share with our God.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you have to initiate each payment.</p> <p>No cost to you or the Church</p>	<p>VANCO Payment Solutions VANCO Payments – With VANCO payments, you create your individual account on the VANCO site, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church’s account Benefits: If you like points or miles, then this is your site! VANCO is the only option that accepts credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments</p> <p>Transaction Fees for the Church</p>	<p>Direct Payment From IRA Direct Transfer – If you are 70 ½ or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA. Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. Welcome Back – “Lunch On The Hill”

Prior to shut down due to Covid, Saint Luke’s “Lunch on the Hill” offered lunches every Wednesday to our surrounding community with a focus on the clients of the Food Pantry. **"Lunch On The Hill" has resumed lunches on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday every month.**

You may recall that in the past lunches had been provided by local restaurants with sides being provided by the host Church. Due to the current economy and shortage of labor, we will be moving ahead with a combination of lunches provided by a restaurant and lunches prepared in Saint Luke’s Community Kitchen.

Saint Luke’s/ EG Food Pantry will provide lunch on the 2nd Wednesday. Saint Luke’s will prepare Sandwiches, sides, salads, desert etc. The EG food Pantry will assist in providing food to prepare.

Our Lady of Mercy (OLM)/ Wild Harvest will provide lunch on the 4th Wednesday. Wild Harvest will provide sandwiches and soup or a side. OLM will provide additional sides, salad, desert etc.

We are excited about resuming our outreach to our community and support to our neighbors.

Coffee Hour is Back!

We are pleased to announce that Coffee Hour is back! As Covid restrictions are being lifted somewhat, we feel it's the right time to bring back Coffee Hour.

We need your help! There is a quarterly sign-up sheet posted across from the office under our beautiful mosaic. Both services have spots to sign up to host a Sunday. We will continue to host in the atrium until our kitchen is ready. Our sexton makes the urn of coffee in the morning. The host provides juice, creamer for the coffee (although powdered coffee creamer is available in a pinch), and some baked goods of some sort. All supplies like cups, napkins, sugar, utensils are all located in the cupboard in the Blackburn Room. There are a few platters you can use to put goodies on. A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality – welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart. Jesus equated our love for each other and our neighbors with our love for Him. "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40)
