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Dear Brothers and Sisters,

John Maxwell, pastor and acclaimed writer on the task of leadership, once wrote, "*Change is inevitable. Growth is optional.*" I've often returned to these words of wisdom every time I've faced the prospect of change. Now is such an occasion. And after numerous conversations with parishioners and staff, I am excited to announce three important changes.

**First, as we resume our youth faith formation offerings (the first classes scheduled for September 17), we will be introducing an entirely new approach and curriculum for grades 6-12.** Informed by the input of our parents and teachers, which very much echoed the wisdom of a recent webinar I attended, we are departing from the traditional Sunday School calendar, where we began classes in September and concluded in May. Our new approach to youth faith formation will offer "modules," on average six weeks long, each focusing upon a specific theme, each culminating with a particular event/celebration/or rite. (Think about the framework for our Corporate Communion offering and you get some sense of what we will be replicating for other themes.)

The benefits of such an approach are many. To begin with, the themes, based upon relevant, real-life matters, will be carefully selected and promoted in advance, so parents and kids alike will know what to expect each Sunday. Second, the offerings will have a time-specific beginning, middle, and end (as opposed to the traditional long and loosely defined calendar). Third, by concluding each module with some kind of special event, we expect this approach to keep the youth better engaged as they move through the arc of the lessons. And finally, in shifting to a more thematic approach, no longer will our teachers be asked to teach an entire year. Instead, we will recruit teachers for each specific theme, greatly reducing the weight of expectations and commitment. I couldn't be more excited about these changes and, thus far, the parents with whom I have spoken seem to share in this excitement.

But wait—there's more!

**Classes for all our youth will happen concurrent to worship (during our Liturgy of the Word).** Whether the youth are attending Godly Play classes (which will go on unchanged) or the 6-8 and 9-12 grade classes, drop-off will be at 9:50. Then the youth will join our worship at the time of announcements (and therefore be present for the Eucharist).

Now, if you haven't glazed over in reading this, you might be thinking, "So what am I supposed to do from 9:50-10:15?" A question which brings me to **a third change: as of "Kick-off Sunday," September 10, we will return to the service schedule of 8:00 and 10:00.** So, the answer to your question is, "Come to church!"

You might recall that we had changed to the slightly off schedule of

7:45/10:15 to allow for a fuller Christian Education hour for all ages. But now, with adult faith formation happening mostly on Wednesday nights, and with families struggling to get their children to a 9:30 class and then stay for a 10:15 service, the extra time in between services is no longer needed nor desirable.

Although no schedule is perfect, the vestry, staff, and I are excited about these changes. I know they will take some getting-used-to, and undoubtedly there will be some hiccups as we live into them. But you all have always demonstrated yourselves to be flexible, forgiving, and patient—all of which should serve us well in the coming months.

Please, if you have any questions or thoughts, do not hesitate to be in touch.

In the years to come, might we change our minds or approach again, based upon future experiences and discoveries? Perhaps. But I am emboldened by my trust in you, my faith in the Holy Spirit, and the wisdom of Winston Churchill, who wrote, *"To improve is to change; to be perfect is to change often."*

Blessings to you and yours as our summer begins to wind down.

#### Notes:

##### Income

Total Income is \$16,832 over budget – most of the overage can be found in the personal pledge category. We are seeing an overall trend of families being current on their pledges, while others are paying in full early. The former trend is likely due to 63% of the payments using some form of online giving, while the latter trend is the increase in IRA QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution). The number of families taking advantage of that has more than tripled!

##### Expenses

· Expenses are under budget by \$32,477. Much of that is the unfilled position for youth and family ministry (Now filled, welcome Amy!) and the pending project work (new flooring in the 1<sup>st</sup> floor hallways and new windows in the choir room).

**Other thoughts**

· We have been blessed with some outstanding staff members here at St. Luke’s, and I know we appreciate all of them. A few years back, we made a commitment to fully staff the Parish. We agreed that we need two full time clergy, a full time Parish Administrator, a Minister of Music, a youth and family minister and a full time sexton. What would that mean in dollars? A full time clergy, thru the end of July, would have incurred \$54,174 in expenses. If you back out what we paid Jonathan (assuming we wouldn’t have both), it’s an additional \$38,864. A full time sexton would have cost \$30,082 thru July 31. If you back out what we’ve paid in sexton expenses, it would be an additional \$22,149. And had Amy been employed the full year, it would represent an additional \$10,743, for a total net cost of \$71,756. To do that thru pledging alone, it would mean an additional 21% or so. The past several years have been relatively flat in terms of pledge income:

As you know, the leadership team is actively working on alternative ways to raise income, and our endowment should see a significant increase if the Tiffany window is sold. But the core support belongs to us. I feel this congregation has always supported the Parish, and I am truly humbled at times in viewing this generosity first hand. So I will leave it here for your consideration.
