St. Luke's Choristers in England ~

On August 5, St. Cecilia choristers Tori Cormier, Ryan Scarber, Shawn Scarber, and I joined with the choirs of Grace Church, Providence, for a 10-day choral trip to England. 51 people boarded a bus in Providence and headed to Logan airport on Saturday afternoon. Included were 35 singers (ages 10 to 75), 2 music staff, 4 chaperones, 1 priest, and 9 parent/family "groupies" who were along for the ride! These groupies included our own Christine and Jason Scarber who were immensely helpful in aiding the trip chaperones. We safely made it to London's busy Heathrow airport on Sunday morning around 9 am, and boarded another bus which took us to Salisbury, about 90 miles south of London. This was to be our home for the next week. The choir had the inimitable experience of living on the cathedral grounds (Salisbury Cathedral School) and singing daily services in the glorious Gothic cathedral, which is just over 800 years old. We garnered high praise from locals and cathedral officials alike for our singing, and truly felt that we were living the life of a cathedral chorister. The daily rhythm of Evensong, with its prayers and music, lodged itself happily in our hearts and gave each day a shape and point. It would be an understatement to say what a profound time we had, both spiritually and musically, singing each day in that ancient and sacred space...truly a "thin place" experience. The choristers (children and youth) had the opportunity to do some sightseeing as well, including a trip to Stonehenge, and a day at the beach in Weymouth, on the south coast. We were treated to a tour of Salisbury Cathedral, and many of us enjoyed a tower tour, climbing nearly 200 feet for unparalleled views of the countryside. A special treat was having Dr. Barry Rose as our guest conductor for Evensong on Friday. Dr. Rose, formerly Master of the Choir at St. Paul's, London, led our choir festival in Providence this past February, and our St. Luke's choristers were delighted to see him again (Dr. Rose will be back in RI to lead our chorister festival in February 2024).

On Saturday it was on to London, where the choristers checked into the Celtic Hotel on Russell Square. It was a beautiful day, so we walked to Westminster Abbey and attended Evensong, which was sung by the choir of St. John the Divine in New York City. Following Evensong, we walked through St. James Park, and by Buckingham Palace. Sunday was a busy day, as we left our hotel early for Southwark Cathedral on the south side of the Thames. Southwark is a busy and wonderful place, a vibrant congregation set in an ancient cathedral. Again, our singers were in top form, singing both the morning Eucharist and afternoon Evensong. Monday was our final day and given over to sightseeing in London. We took in the London Eye, a colorful merry-go-round, lunch near the Thames, and the Tower of London.

We were quite fortunate with our travel and had an on-time departure and landing as we left Heathrow for Logan on Tuesday. Everyone was weary but in the best way. Our St. Luke's choristers were fantastic musical additions to the choir, and they formed lasting friendships with the Grace choristers. 

#### Income

• Total Income is \$16,832 over budget – most of the overage can be found in the personal pledge category. We are seeing an overall trend of families being current on their pledges, while others are paying in full early. The former trend is likely due to 63% of the payments using some form of online giving, while the latter trend is the increase in IRA QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution). The number of families taking advantage of that has more than tripled!

#### **Expenses**

• Expenses are under budget by \$32,477. Much of that is the unfilled position for youth and family ministry (Now filled, welcome Amy!) and the pending project work (new flooring in the 1<sup>st</sup> floor hallways and new windows in the choir room).

#### Other thoughts

We have been blessed with some outstanding staff members here at St. Luke's, and I know we appreciate all of them. A few years back, we made a commitment to fully staff the Parish. We agreed that we need two full time clergy, a full time Parish Administrator, a Minister of Music, a youth and family minister and a full time sexton. What would that mean in dollars? A full time clergy, thru the end of July, would have incurred \$54,174 in expenses. If you back out what we paid Jonathan (assuming we wouldn't have both), it's an additional \$38,864. A full time sexton would have cost \$30,082 thru July 31. If you back out what we've paid in sexton expenses, it would be an additional \$22,149. And had Amy been employed the full year, it would represent an additional \$10,743, for a total net cost of \$71,756. To do that thru pledging alone, it would mean an additional 21% or so. The past several years have been relatively flat in terms of pledge income:

But the core support belongs to us. I feel this congregation has always supported the Parish, and I am truly humbled at times in viewing this generosity first hand. So I will leave it here for your consideration.

Online Banking Bill Pay – with online bill pay, you add St. Luke's Church as a payee, enter our address of 99 Peirce St. East Greenwich, RI 02818 and schedule

your payment. Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use online bill pay, then you are familiar with making payments this way. You can schedule single payments, or set up regular payments in advance.

No cost to you or the Church.

Zelle Transfer Zelle Payment – with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the giving@stlukeseg.org address. Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you have to initiate each payment.

No cost to you or the Church

VANCO Payment Solutions VANCO Payments – With VANCO payments, you create your individual account on the VANCO site, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's account

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then this is your site! VANCO is the only option that accepts credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments or make on the income. not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

Transaction Fees for the Church

Direct Payment From IRA Direct Transfer – If you are 70 ½ or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA. Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

# **Greetings from our Food Cupboard!**

As we head into summer, the shelves are getting bare as the need goes up.
