Dear Brothers and Sisters,

These past couple of weeks, whenever Diane and I are out driving around at night, we like to take the long way home. We love winding through our surrounding neighborhoods, checking out the Christmas decorations in people's yards. (I'm particularly charmed by the inflatable Snoopys, a favorite character from my childhood.) We love seeing the many homes framed by lights hung around the borders. (Although we have a difference of opinion in the matter of white verses colored lights.) And we love looking into people's homes catching a glimpse of the Christmas trees displayed in their windows. (Based upon our findings, it seems tinsel is out this year.)

Earlier in the week, while on one such drive, we were discussing the fun of this annual tradition-- how it gives us such a simple pleasure and how it helps stir our Christmas spirit. At one point Diane commented, "I love it when the lights go up. It helps take away the gloominess of these increasingly darkening days." And then she added, "It feels like people are trying to provide a little light to brighten up all the darkness."

I think she's right (as always) and I finished our drive pondering the reason all the lights are more than pretty— why they are so heartwarming. It is, I believe, because they offer a bit of light in a time of such deep darkness.

And then, call it a coincidence or maybe even gift of the Holy Spirit, I returned home that night, opened up a book of prayers I have by my bedside, and read these words, "*How silently, how silently the wondrous gift is given. Help us to be silent now, Lord, and expectant... that we may receive the gift we need... so we may become the gifts others need. Amen* (Ted Loder, *Guerrillas of Grace*)

In reflecting upon that prayer, I was reminded of the power and possibility each of us possesses. We can be a gift to others; we can be light in a time of deep darkness.

Of course, when we pluck an ornament off our Giving Tree, we become that gift others need. But I think, more subtly yet more powerfully, when we pass a stranger on the street or in the malls, make eye contact, and speak a warm, "hello," we just might be that much-needed gift as well.

This is a time of such business, when we often find ourselves pushing just to make our way through the crowds. Imagine how you can change the pulse of a moment and warm the heart of another merely by offering an unexpected greeting. It is a gift that takes little time and requires even less money.

You know, we spend so much time and money on decorations to brighten the darkness. Consider that the best light we might have to offer this season is that which naturally shines through you and me.

### Adult Faith Formation Book Study

Join us for a soul journey as we read *Surrender to Love* by David Benner, PhD. Wednesdays during Advent and Christmas at 7pm by Zoom. We will meet November 29, December 6 and 13, and January 3 and 10.

This book explores the themes of love and surrender as the heart of Christian spirituality. Reflecting on Scripture and Christian tradition, Dr. Benner shows how God invites us to trust fully in God's perfect love. God is love, and God wants us to live in this love. *Surrender to Love* will lead us to an unexpected place, where yielding to God frees us to become who God created us to be.

God doesn't want us to respond out of fear or obligation. Rather, God invites us to enter into an authentic relationship of intimacy and devotion as God calls us to move beyond obedience—by surrendering to love.

David Benner, PhD, is an internationally known psychologist whose work has been directed toward facilitating a journey of awakening and transformation. This book focuses on living the spiritual journey in a deeply human way and the human journey in a deeply spiritual way.

## Did You Know?

The IRA Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) allows for direct gifts to St. Luke's Church through your IRA:

- An easy way to make a gift or fulfill your pledge from your IRA
- A tax-free rollover is excluded from your gross income
- A great way to meet your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) at 72 years of age

The Rules of IRA Qualified Charitable Distributions:

- It must be from an IRA (other retirement accounts are not eligible)
- Transfers must go directly to St. Luke's from your IRA
- You must be 70 ½ at the time of your gift
- Your total IRA gifts cannot exceed \$100,000

Prior to shut down due to Covid, Saint Luke's "Lunch on the Hill" offered lunches every Wednesday to our surrounding community with a focus on the clients of the Food Pantry. **"Lunch On The Hill" has resumed lunches on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday every month.**

You may recall that in the past lunches had been provided by local restaurants with sides being provided by the host Church. Due to the current economy and shortage of labor, we will be moving ahead with a combination of lunches provided by a restaurant and lunches prepared in Saint Luke's Community Kitchen.

Saint Luke's/ EG Food Pantry will provide lunch on the 2nd Wednesday. Saint Luke's will prepare Sandwiches, sides, salads, desert etc. The EG food Pantry will assist in providing food to prepare.

Our Lady of Mercy (OLM)/ Wild Harvest will provide lunch on the 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday. Wild Harvest will provide sandwiches and soup or a side. OLM will provide additional sides, salad, desert etc.
