A Note From Bishop Knisely

A friend of mine once gave me a small stone from the Sea of Galilee as a gift. He told me about how he had waded out into the water of the lake to reach down and find a stone that he thought Jesus himself might have once walked upon. I am deeply touched by his thoughtful gift, and that little stone has a place of honor among the other wonderful little gifts that people shared with me over the years. But let me tell you something ... if we spend a moment and do a little math, we can work out that with every breath we take, we inhale and exhale hundreds and thousands of atoms of air that our Lord inhaled and exhaled during the time of his earthly incarnation among us. With every breath we take we breathe the breath of Christ Jesus – the Lamb of God, our Savior and our Redeemer.

So, our breath is sacred because in it we are united with Christ. But our unity to God doesn't just start or stop with our breath — it is found in the water we drink, the food we consume, the tears we shed, the water with which we baptize, the bread and the wine we eat and drink. All things upon this wondrous earth have been touched by God, not only through creation, but through the Incarnation of Jesus upon this planet we all share.

God who made all things, the heavens and the Earth, the galaxies, the stars, planets, moons, comets, the fires of space and the music of the spheres, literally shares the very breath we breathe — as we all share together in the existence that God undergirds with Agape love.

The meaning of the Incarnation is that there can be no artificial divorce between the heavenly and the earthly. It reminds us that the Greeks were wrong when they thought that the only way to find the divine was to reject the earthly. Instead, because of the doctrine of the incarnation, God with Us, Immanuel, we know that there is no place in our lives upon this planet Earth that we cannot encounter God and God's redemptive love.

Let me repeat that — there is no divorce between Heaven and Earth. This is the message of the Incarnation. God in Jesus has redeemed it all. There is no need to escape the earthly and move toward the heavenly.

I'll tell you a great secret — if you look around you cannot avoid stumbling over the presence of God.Certainly, there are times when it is easier to see God in the world — like in the joy of Christmas morning as friends and family gather to exchange gifts and luxuriate in the warmth of their shared love.We see God in the faces of the volunteers at soup kitchens that on Christmas Day will feed hundreds of people, giving earthly food and joy to people who may not have either.But we can also see God in the face of a person laying ill in the hospital tonight, knowing that so many people are working to return them to health.We can even see God in long lines at the stores these past days, knowing that family members are so grateful for our presence in their life that they are willing to endure long waits to find us that simple gift that will show us how much we mean to them.

Adult Faith Formation Book Study

Join us for a soul journey as we read *Surrender to Love* by David Benner, PhD. Wednesdays during Advent and Christmas at 7pm by Zoom. We will meet November 29, December 6 and 13, and January 3 and 10.

This book explores the themes of love and surrender as the heart of Christian spirituality. Reflecting on Scripture and Christian tradition, Dr. Benner shows how God invites us to trust fully in God's perfect love. God is love, and God wants us to live in this love. *Surrender to Love* will lead us to an unexpected place, where yielding to God frees us to become who God created us to be.

God doesn't want us to respond out of fear or obligation. Rather, God invites us to enter into an authentic relationship of intimacy and devotion as God calls us to move beyond obedience—by surrendering to love.

David Benner, PhD, is an internationally known psychologist whose work has been directed toward facilitating a journey of awakening and transformation. This book focuses on living the spiritual journey in a deeply human way and the human journey in a deeply spiritual way.

Prior to shut down due to Covid, Saint Luke's "Lunch on the Hill" offered lunches every Wednesday to our surrounding community with a focus on the clients of the Food Pantry. "Lunch On The Hill" has resumed lunches on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday every month.

You may recall that in the past lunches had been provided by local restaurants with sides being provided by the host Church. Due to the current economy and shortage of labor, we will be moving ahead with a combination of lunches provided by a restaurant and lunches prepared in Saint Luke's Community Kitchen.

Saint Luke's/EG Food Pantry will provide lunch on the 2nd Wednesday. Saint Luke's will prepare Sandwiches, sides, salads, desert etc. The EG food Pantry will assist in providing food to prepare.

Our Lady of Mercy (OLM)/ Wild Harvest will provide lunch on the 4 th Wednesday. Wild Harvest will provide sandwiches and soup or a side. OLM will provide additional sides, salad, desert etc.

We are excited about resuming our outreach to our community and support to our neighbors.

We will continue to host in the atrium until our kitchen is ready. Our sexton makes the urn of coffee in the morning. The host provides juice, creamer for the coffee (although powdered coffee creamer is available in a pinch), and some baked goods of some sort. All supplies like cups, napkins, sugar, utensils are all located in the cupboard in the Blackburn Room. There are a few platters you can use to put goodies on. A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality – welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart. Jesus equated our love for each other and our neighbors with our love for Him. "Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." For several years, the Food Cupboard has benefited by receiving donations from Stop and Shop on Frenchtown Rd. These donations include meat, milk and dairy products, bread and other items that are pulled from the shelves before their use by dates expire. Stop and Shop would like us to pick up three times a week rather than the one time we currently do. We would like to put together two more teams to pick up Wednesdays and Fridays. The pickups would be done around 8:15 AM allowing time to get to the Food Cupboard and weigh, count and restock the items before the Food Cupboard opens at 10:30. Chris will train each volunteer and each person will have about 15 minutes training by computer. We need volunteers who can lift 45 pounds and who can commit to the early pickup time each week for an hour or so.

This is a critical program for the Food Cupboard, and we would really appreciate anyone who is willing to help as a volunteer! Please help so we can continue to benefit from this program.
