As I have said before, I will say again: I have found the joy and fullness of our Easter celebration is directly related to the thoughtfulness and intentionality by which we move through Lent. So let me invite you to begin your journey through Lent by attending one of our Ash Wednesday services (noon and 7:00pm). And given that the 14th is a certain day on the secular calendar as well, feel free to bring along your special Valentine, too!

Many of us who have grown up in some Christian tradition that observes Lent have a host of associations with this season. Practices such as abstinence and fasting are familiar if not common. Besides these acts of sacrifice, some also engage in additional activities additional prayer, additional reading, additional service.

To disavow anyone of the notion that Lent is a competition sport, let me say, all of these options have the makings of wonderful choices. They require some degree of thoughtfulness. They require some element of discipline. They "disturb" our regular routines. Good stuff, to be sure!

But I want to add, at the heart of why we engage in any sort of Lenten practice are these two related questions: How can I deepen my relationship with God? And, how can I live a more faith-filled life? Absent consideration of these questions, our Lenten choices, while admirable, end up feeling more like a challenge to be endured than an invitation to be embraced.

Over the next several weeks of Lent, St. Luke's will be offering a host of possibilities to fill your journey and feed your faith. Besides the usual Women of Grace, Theology on Tap, Christ Community Kitchen, Lunch on the Hill, Mobile Loaves and Fishes, and Adult Faith Formation classes (based upon the novel, show, and movie *Les Mis*), there also will be a daily blog (we still need writers to cover one of the days), a weekly Thursday night meditation and Eucharist (at 6:00pm), and a lovely Sunday afternoon Evensong (March 10 at 4:00pm).

I hope you will find something(s) amongst these offerings that might enrichen your walk through Lent. And I pray that come Easter (March 31) we all might find ourselves having moved even a bit closer to God.

Consequently, gently Used Coats, Sweatshirts, Fleeces, Hats and Gloves are in great need this month. If you are dropping off items before February 17th, please mark them for Loaves and Fishes and leave them by the Parish office.

We need your help! There is a quarterly sign-up sheet posted across from the office under our beautiful mosaic. Both services have spots to sign up to host a Sunday. We will continue to host in the atrium until our kitchen is ready. Our sexton makes the urn of coffee in the morning. The host provides juice, creamer for the coffee (although powdered coffee creamer is available in a pinch), and some baked goods of some sort. All supplies like cups, napkins, sugar, utensils are all located in the cupboard in the Blackburn Room. There are a few platters you can use to put goodies on. A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality – welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart.
