Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I was kind of cranky (or more truthfully, ticked off) when I went into the church this past Tuesday for our noon-time healing service. Just before leaving my house, I had been catching up on the news and read about a recent GOP rally in Kansas where attendees punched, kicked, and took a baseball bat to an effigy of President Biden.

Now before you accuse me of engaging in partisan politics, let me acknowledge that both parties seem all too inclined towards meanspirited attacks on the opposition side. And I also want to note that in this particular case one former GOP leader immediately denounced the event as "shameful" and "wrong."

So regardless of party, I have to say I am disappointed, horrified, and, if honest, angry at the quality of our political discourse and conduct these days. What's the matter with us? How have we lost all sense of respect and decorum? Why are we so animated by anger these days? (And yes, I do hear the irony in my question as I ask it with my own simmering anger.)

These were my thoughts and feelings as I sat down on Tuesday to do some quick research on the saint of the day, Gregory the Great. Often, I like to Google famous quotes from these saints and here is what I read from Gregory: "You cannot acquire the gift of peace if by your anger you destroy the peace of the Lord."

Imagine that?! I could not help but think that this 6 th century saint was speaking directly to me, to us, today.

As we head into the 2024 election process, which now appears to be a do-over of the 2020 election, interviews suggest not only a great deal of disappointment but a fair amount of anger. And it occurs to me at least one of the questions we must consider is, "What will we contribute to the content, tenor, and tone of discourse?" Despite the overwhelming images and news stories, we do have some agency; we do play some part in how these next several months will unfold.

I, for one, will be attempting to pay attention to my pulse and emotions. I will strive to listen and to engage respectfully, even when in the company of those with whom I vehemently disagree. And I will try to remember the wisdom of Saint Gregory, who also wrote, "Moreover, because the slothful mind is typically brought to its downfall gradually, when we fail to control our speech, we move on to more harsh words. Thus, at first, we are happy to speak of others kindly; afterwards, we begin to pick at the lives of those of whom we speak, and finally our tongues break into open slander against them."



Dear Parents,

We are in the planning stages for the Corporate Communion program at St. Luke's Church. It is open to all children in the 4th grade.

Children understand the symbolism and significance of the Eucharist in ways that are often surprising and delightful. It is no wonder that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me!"

Since the 1991 *Prayerbook*, our church has lived into the theology that Baptism is full initiation into the Body of Christ, moving away from the idea that Confirmation and "understanding" are the bench marks for participation in the Eucharist.

Corporate Communion is a remarkable communion instruction, *not preparation class*. It is designed to offer age-appropriate theology, liturgy and tradition to children. **Children are not the future of the church; they are the church today.** This class honors their full membership in the Body of Christ, and equips us grownups for the vows we made at their Baptism that we would support them in their life in Christ.



Total Income	\$151,243	\$127,758	\$23,485	\$716,650
Total Expenses	\$129,552	\$126,252	\$3,300	\$767,967
Net Income	\$21,691	\$1,506	\$20,185	(\$51,317)

Notes:

- Income \$23,485 ahead of budget most of this is found in pledge income (\$21,371).
- Expenses \$3,300 over budget \$2,055 in utilities and \$8,169 in copier cost are the largest culprits. The old copier vendor was bought out, and the new copier vendor has increased the cost per copy significantly.

Bill Pay - with online bill pay, you add St. Luke's Church as a payee, enter our address of 99 Peirce St. East Greenwich, RI 02818 and schedule your payment.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use online bill pay, then you are familiar with making payments this way. You can schedule single payments, or set up regular payments in advance.

No cost to you or the Church.

Zelle Transfer

Zelle Payment - with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the seg.org address. Benefits: Ease of use - if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you have to initiate each payment.

No cost to you or the Church

VANCO Payment Solutions

VANCO Payments - With VANCO payments, you create your individual account on the VANCO site, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's account

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then this not reported as taxable income to you. is your site! VANCO is the only option that accepts credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments

Transaction Fees for the Church

Direct Payment From IRA

Direct Transfer - If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA. Benefits: Any funds paid this way are You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality – welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart.
