Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Grace.

I recently spent an hour and a half with the Lenten study group discussing grace, and, as usual, walked away feeling richly blessed. We had just watched a video clip from *Les Mis*, the scene where the police drag Jean Valjean before the Bishop, having found him with a bag full of the church's silver. Valjean had lied to them, claiming the silver was a gift from the Bishop. The police stand ready to throw him in jail for life, just waiting for the Bishop to confirm their suspicions. The Bishop listens to the police and looks upon Jean Valjean. Then, sensing the significance of the moment, he confirms Valjean's fabrication, scolds him for leaving behind the best, and much to everyone's surprise, hands him two additional silver candle sticks. The exchange concludes with the Bishop telling Valjean, "God has raised you out of darkness. I have saved your soul for God."

Such a beautiful snapshot of grace.

As a class, we unpacked the quality of holy grace. It was observed that grace is something offered freely, offered regardless of what might be "deserved" or earned. It is something that doesn't make sense by conventional standards, that goes above and beyond what we might typically do. It is something that often requires forgiveness, always requires compassion. It is something that often precedes faith as opposed to a reward for faith.

And what of the impact of grace? Well, in some cases, it seems we never know. But in the example of Jean Valjean, first we see he is overwhelmed, overcome by tears, almost tortured. But then, it is clear, he is set upon the path to new life; he is indeed "raised out of darkness;" he is virtually reborn. Such is the power of grace. It is transformative; it is life-giving.

And I hasten to add, it is life-giving not just for the recipient but also for the agent of grace. There is no mistaking the serenity, joy, and love animating the bishop.

As we make our way through Lent, let me invite you to reflect upon your own understanding and experience of grace. When have you been the recipient of such a gift? How did it make you feel? What was your response?

Likewise, when have you been an agent of grace? (Make no mistake, grace is not a gift reserved only for God!) What prompted such an act? What was your thinking in the moment? And how did it make you feel?

At some point in the night's discussion, one person asked, "Was the Bishop a sucker?" I suppose, based upon the typical standards of relations, maybe so.

Which of course begs the larger question, is God a sucker? Again,



Total Expenses	\$129,552	\$126,252	\$3,300	\$767,967
Net Income	\$21,691	\$1,506	\$20,185	(\$51,317)

Notes:

- Income - \$23,485 ahead of budget – most of this is found in pledge income (\$21,371).
- Expenses - \$3,300 over budget - \$2,055 in utilities and \$8,169 in copier cost are the largest culprits. The old copier vendor was bought out, and the new copier vendor has increased the cost per copy significantly.

The music is from an American folk song originally composed by Baptist minister Robert Wadworth Lowry in 1868 with the four-part arrangement published by Jeffrey Honoré in 1991. The choirs performed this piece at their 2019 Spring Concert and happily recreated that performance in this video (also available on St. Luke's website and Facebook page).
