# Bishop Knisely's Easter Message 2024

Easter Brings Hope In The Midst Of Doubt

There is good reason to be concerned for ourselves and our world this year. Our nation is heading into an election season that promises to be a recap of the last deeply divisive one; one that ended in a way not seen before in American history. We are experiencing increasingly stormy weather, regular flooding and beach erosion due to rising temperatures and sea levels, and we don't seem to be able to respond with any clear sense of urgency. And while the economy is doing well by most measures, the majority of us aren't feeling better off. And to top it off, we're watching regional wars break out across the globe, the flames of which might quickly spread.

There's good reason to be worried. There's good reason to be pessimistic. There is little reason to be hopeful. But Easter brings hope in the midst of doubt.

Easter changed everything, though only a small group of people understood that at the time. In the decades following the Resurrection, things didn't get better, they got worse. The Roman Empire destroyed the Temple in Jerusalem and drove Jesus' people from their ancestral home. Yet, despite the obvious unfolding calamity, the seeds of a new reality had been planted that were to change everything within a few centuries.

Sustaining our sense of hope is seldom easy, especially if we're focusing on the rush of events and thereby missing the arc of history. Easter is the ground of our hope, though often our hope is more of a spiritual discipline than a clear and present reality. To be an Easter people in a time such as this is to believe when it's difficult to believe. It's an act of faith.

That faith, if really present in us and our communities, is the most precious gift we can give to others; particularly those who despair of what might be. If you have eyes of faith, you can see seeds coming to flower today, things starting to change, things starting to be restored. Crime and violence are down across this nation, the pandemic is ebbing, carbon emissions are declining and extreme poverty around the world is in rapid decline. The troubles on the news these days are, when viewed through the lens of Easter, the birth pangs of the Kingdom of God, flowering all around for those who have eyes to see it

Easter happened and it has changed everything. And I have faith that there's still more to come. Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia.

# **Corporate Communion**

Dear Parents,

We are in the planning stages for the Corporate Communion program at St. Luke's Church. It is open to all children in the 4<sup>th</sup> grade.

Children understand the symbolism and significance of the Eucharist in ways that are often surprising and delightful. It is no wonder that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me!"

Since the 1991 *Prayerbook*, our church has lived into the theology that Baptism is full initiation into the Body of Christ, moving away from the idea that Confirmation and "understanding" are the bench marks for participation in the Eucharist.

Corporate Communion is a remarkable communion instruction, not preparation class. It is designed

to offer age-appropriate theology, liturgy and tradition to children. Children are not the future of the church; they are the church today. This class honors their full membership in the Body of Christ, and equips us grownups for the vows we made at their Baptism that we would support them in their life in Christ.

### **Notes:**

- Income \$23,485 ahead of budget most of this is found in pledge income (\$21,371).
- Expenses \$3,300 over budget \$2,055 in utilities and \$8,169 in copier cost are the largest culprits. The old copier vendor was bought out, and the new copier vendor has increased the cost per copy significantly.

#### Zelle Transfer

Zelle Payment – with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the giving@stlukeseg.org address.
Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making

# VANCO Payment Solutions

VANCO Payments – With VANCO payments, you create your individual account on the VANCO site, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's account.

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then this is your site! VANCO is the only option that accepts credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments

**Transaction Fees for the Church** 

#### **Direct Payment From IRA**

Direct Transfer – If you are 70 ½ or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA.

Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality – welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart.
