Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Two months ago, to this very day, I announced that, come June, Diane and I would be moving to Los Angeles. If you were there, you may recall that I concluded my words by saying, “But for now, let’s keep our focus on Jesus, on having a holy Lent, and on a good celebration of Easter. Oh my goodness— isn’t this exactly what we have done!!

Numerous times throughout Lent I had people speak to me about the meaningfulness of our Lenten blogs, some of them following along from across the country. In their many forms, they were beautiful and insightful, each one a gift. My profound thanks to all of the writers and my great thanks to Rob Walsh, Betsy Fornal, and Pam Gregory, who presided over the entirety of it all.

Also during the weeks of Lent, the Adult Faith Formation class enjoyed a fabulous study of the musical *Les Misérables*. I was amazed but not surprised by the richness of our conversation. Most of us had either seen the musical or film (and a few had even read Hugo’s original novel), but still, being together, we covered new ground. And I dare say we all walked away with a deeper appreciation of these Lenten/Easter themes. I am grateful to everyone who participated in the class.

Then came Holy Week—and what a week it was—all live streamed, I hasten to add, thanks to Deborah Collins, David Clifton, Bill Clement, and Kyle Knowlton.

There were so many other moving parts to the week and so many of you who made it possible.

My thanks to the preachers of Holy Week: Pam Gregory, Victoria Strang, and Nancy Arnold. Their sermons were creative, thoughtful, and deeply moving.

My thanks to Liz Fox, and all the altar guild members, who set up for every service—and did particularly heavy lifting on Maundy Thursday. I also want to send a special thanks out to Deb Lukens, who designed the altar flowers for Lent and Palm Sunday. They were just beautiful.

My thanks to the Maundy Thursday teams: set-up, captained by Arlene Serdakowski (assisted by a band of others), kitchen work, headed by Paul Ruggieri (assisted by sous chef, Margaret Clifton, and a host of line workers), and clean-up, led by Deb and John Lukens (assisted by a crew of indefatigable mates). The dining room was so warm and inviting, the food was amazing, and by the night’s end, all was cleaned up and tucked away.

Maundy Thursday is such a rich night that it could make for a tough act to follow, and yet the Good Friday Taizé service is even more beloved and beautiful to many, both within the parish and the wider

community. I have experienced it for several years now, but the music provided by the choir never fails to move me. We all owe the choir our great thanks. (Let me also add, each time the Taizé service ends without incident, I am grateful to Paul Brookes who stands by quietly to make sure the church isn't burned down!)

And then, finally, we get to our Easter celebrations, which include a powerful Easter Vigil on Saturday night (followed by Prosecco and chocolate-covered strawberries, courtesy of Anna Pilkington) and two joy-filled Easter services Sunday morning. Again, the altar guild came out in full force to decorate the church; the choirs provided spectacular music; and a host of liturgical players from ushers to acolytes (honestly, I lost count of how many times Catherine Pilkington acolyted throughout the week), to LEM's to readers, played their critical parts.

Even now, as I re-read this note, I marvel at the countless persons who made our Lent and Easter so wonderful!

And, of course, no thank you note regarding the season would be complete without thanking our wonderful staff. Christina tends to so many aspects of our corporate life with kindness, patience, and care. Rodney leads the choirs with all the same qualities as well as with amazing creativity. Jonathan's contributions over this span of time, which ranged from pastoral care to fabulous preaching (if you weren't at our Vigil, watch his sermon online) were critical to the care and feeding of our entire congregation, myself included. And I have no doubt Emma's steady and creative "digital evangelism" contributed to our largest attendance figures in years.

I feel so blessed to share this work with all of them, just as I feel so blessed to share Lent and Easter with all of you. I never take for granted all that you do nor all that we share, but for obvious reasons, these past several weeks have been uniquely special to me. If Lent and Easter are about service and faith, forgiveness and patience, grace and love, then I cannot imagine a better group of people to have as companions as I make my way through these seasons. For that, I say, thank you. And thanks be to God.

- March 1: Wardens met with Canon Dena Cleaver-Bartholomew to review transition process
- April 14: Canon Dena Cleaver Bartholomew meets with the Parish to preach, pray and conduct Town Hall Q&A session
- Mid-April: Four Committees reviewed with vestry -- Prayer, Communications, Profile, and Search
- April-May: Prayer team begins work on prayer to share in June
- May-June: Communications team starts website review and Search site
- Overall transition process estimated to be 12-18 months, more to come ...

- Early-mid summer: Interim Rector identified – supply clergy fill in as needed
- Summer: Vestry reviews profile & search committee processes aligned with Diocesan activities to engage parish at large
- Mid/late fall: Interim & Wardens make recommendations to Diocese regarding transition timeline
- Late fall/early winter: Diocesan-led History Event with parish to provide foundation for online profile
- Winter: Diocesan-led parish small-group conversations to further inform online church profile
- More to come on Interim selection, team formation, Diocesan engagement with congregation, and church profile development ...

- A national search will be conducted -- we expect to attract many amazing candidates as St. Luke's is considered a highly favorable site
- Rector applications will come from the national church to the Diocese, who vets and sends qualified applicants to our Search Team and vestry

Dear Parents,

We are in the planning stages for the Corporate Communion program at St. Luke's Church. It is open to all children in the 4th grade.

Children understand the symbolism and significance of the Eucharist in ways that are often surprising and delightful. It is no wonder that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me!"

Since the 1991 *Prayerbook*, our church has lived into the theology that Baptism is full initiation into the Body of Christ, moving away from the idea that Confirmation and "understanding" are the bench marks for participation in the Eucharist.

Corporate Communion is a remarkable communion instruction, *not preparation class*. It is designed to offer age-appropriate theology, liturgy and tradition to children. **Children are not the future of the church; they are the church today.** This class honors their full membership in the Body of Christ, and equips us grownups for the vows we made at their Baptism that we would support them in their life in Christ.

We need your help! There is a quarterly sign-up sheet posted across from the office under our beautiful mosaic. Both services have spots to sign up to host a Sunday. We will continue to host in the atrium until our kitchen is ready. Our sexton makes the urn of coffee in the morning. The host provides juice, creamer for the coffee (although powdered coffee creamer is available in a pinch), and some baked goods of some sort. All supplies like cups, napkins, sugar, utensils are all located in the cupboard in the Blackburn Room. There are a few platters you can use to put goodies on. A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality - welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart.
