Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Does it have to be either/or?

Earlier this week, as I was re-reading a book from the “Church’s Teachings for a Changing World” series, I was reminded of one of the things I love best about our Episcopal way: we are a denomination that believes in a both/and rather than an either/or approach.

What does this mean? Well, it means that we can both honor tradition/and remain dynamic regarding everything from liturgy to theology. It means individuals might hold true to a certain amoral theology/and still honor differing truths of others sitting across the aisle. And, most foundationally, it means that we follow a Jesus who was both human/and divine.

Eric Law and Stephanie Spellers sum it up this way: “*We follow Jesus Christ (who) was and is both/and, drawing together human and divine. We hope to be both/and Christians, drawing together and embracing ancient traditions and the wisdom just over the horizon, reason and mystery, beauty and justice, catholic and Protestant, discipline and freedom, ... the cross and resurrection.*” (*The Episcopal Way*, p. 9)

Over the past several years, it seems like we have been living in a world operating more out of an either/or approach. Either you are a Republican/or a Democrat. Either you are pro-choice or “pro-life.” Either you are pro-vaccines or anti-vax. And of course, most recently, either you are pro-Israel or pro-Palestine.

Does it have to be either/or?

This kind of either/or thinking has led so many people to dramatically polarized positions, has it not? In terms of the latest dichotomy, too often, if one is pro-Israel, then any and all military activity, regardless of civilian suffering, is justified in pursuit of safety. And if one is pro-Palestinian, then all Israeli efforts represent war crimes. If one is pro-Israel, then there should be no aid to address the human rights crisis facing countless Palestinians. And if one is pro-Palestinian, then there should be no military aid provided to the Israeli government.

Not only are these positions lacking in any empathy, reflection, or nuance, but they often lead to the rash and generalized conclusions that if one is pro-Israel then one must be Islamophobic, and if one is pro-Palestinian then one must also be antisemitic. How can there be any meaningful conversation across opinions, concerns, and peoples when we are standing on such extreme ground and engaging in such provocative labeling?

Does it have to be either/or?

Why can't one's heart break for both those Israelis who lost their lives on October 7 (as well as those still held hostage) and for the hundreds of thousands of displaced Palestinian people who currently face deprivation of every kind? Why can't one hope that the Israelis might have a homeland where they can live safely, and where the Palestinian people might also have a homeland where they can live prosperously? And why can't we disagree here in this country—even protesting as an expression of

that disagreement—and yet resist demonizing the other (not to mention remain in relationship with one another)?

As Episcopalians, and frankly as followers of Jesus, these are times when our “Episcopal Way” is being tested. What is our thinking? What is the language we are using? How do we find ourselves interacting with others who might think differently? (Do we even find ourselves interacting with others who might think differently?)

This is not a time when we can afford to be either citizens of a world in chaos or followers of Jesus. God knows, more than ever, now we need to be a people of both/and.

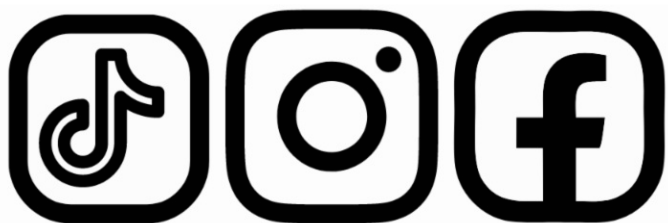

We are embarking on a transition to a new Rector

The Wardens and Vestry are currently interviewing Interim candidates, which should continue into May. In the meantime, we invite your questions and comments as the transition process continues to unfold.

Fr. Tim makes his announcement

- March-April: Wardens met with Canon Dena Cleaver-Bartholomew; Canon Dena met with Parish and led Town Hall
- April-May: Prayer team begins work on prayer to share in June
- **Mid-April into May: Wardens and vestry receive materials and complete interviews with Interim candidates** ★ We are here
- May: Vestry reviews process for filling/completing teams -- Prayer, Communications, Profile, and Search
- May-June: Communications team starts website review and Search site
- Overall transition process estimated to be 12-18 months, more to come ...

The Transition begins

- Early-mid summer: Interim Rector identified – supply clergy fill in as needed
- Summer: Vestry reviews profile & search committee processes aligned with Diocesan activities to engage parish at large
- Mid/late fall: Interim & Wardens make recommendations to Diocese regarding transition timeline
- Late fall/early winter: Diocesan-led History Event with parish to provide foundation for online profile
- Winter: Diocesan-led parish small-group conversations to further inform online church profile
- More to come on Interim selection, team formation, Diocesan engagement with congregation, and church profile development ...

The Search Begins

- A national search will be conducted – we expect to attract many amazing candidates as St. Luke's is considered a highly favorable site
- Rector applications will come from the national church to the Diocese, who vets and sends qualified applicants to our Search Team and vestry
- More to come as the search process commences ...

Dear Parents,

We are in the planning stages for the Corporate Communion program at St. Luke's Church. It is open to all children in the 4th grade.

Children understand the symbolism and significance of the Eucharist in ways that are often surprising and delightful. It is no wonder that Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me!"

Since the 1991 *Prayerbook*, our church has lived into the theology that Baptism is full initiation into the Body of Christ, moving away from the idea that Confirmation and "understanding" are the bench marks for participation in the Eucharist.

Corporate Communion is a remarkable communion instruction , *not preparation class* . It is designed

to offer age-appropriate theology, liturgy and tradition to children. **Children are not the future of the church; they are the church today.** This class honors their full membership in the Body of Christ, and equips us grownups for the vows we made at their Baptism that we would support them in their life in Christ.

Coffee Hour is Back!

We are pleased to announce that Coffee Hour is back! As Covid restrictions are being lifted somewhat, we feel it's the right time to bring back Coffee Hour.

We need your help! There is a quarterly sign-up sheet posted across from the office under our beautiful mosaic. Both services have spots to sign up to host a Sunday. We will continue to host in the atrium until our kitchen is ready. Our sexton makes the urn of coffee in the morning. The host provides juice, creamer for the coffee (although powdered coffee creamer is available in a pinch), and some baked goods of some sort. All supplies like cups, napkins, sugar, utensils are all located in the cupboard in the Blackburn Room. There are a few platters you can use to put goodies on. A table is set up in the atrium with a tablecloth on it. Afterwards, we ask that the coffee urn be washed out and set out to dry in the sink area of the Blackburn Room.

You can host with a friend, you can host with your kids, you can host solo - it's a wonderful way to be part of our St. Luke's hospitality – welcoming new faces and encouraging us all to reconnect in person after so many months of being apart.
