Our Bishop Nicholas Knisely graciously welcomed me to the Diocese of Rhode Island last Friday in his office in Providence. During our conversation, I learned that he is thoughtful, kind, wicked smart, and prayerful. He used an analogy that I would like to share with you.

The analogy concerns the human body. The Bishop pointed out that on average we replace all of the cells in our body every seven years. Skin and gastrointestinal cells replicate much faster, while bone, neurons and heart muscle regenerates at a much slower rate. What is fascinating about our ongoing cellular regeneration is that through that massive change the pattern we call our 'self' or our 'soul' persists across time.

Each person seems to carry patterns forward that we can easily identify as characteristic of that person. These patterns are part biology, part conditioning and partly an epigenetic inheritance across generations.

No cost to you or the Church

Zelle Transfer

Zelle Payment – with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the giving@stlukeseg.org address.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you will have to initiate each payment.

PayPal and VANCO Payment Solutions

PayPal and VANCO Payments – With PayPal and VANCO payments, you create your individual accounts on their sites, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then these are your sites! They are the only options that accept credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments.

Transaction Fees for the Church

Direct Payment From IRA

Direct Transfer – If you are 70½ or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA.

Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

E-pistle Continued from above

My Jewish friends taught me about the generational trauma passed along in families of holocaust survivors: a heightened sense of threat and a nervous system wired to quickly act on perceived threats through flight, fight, freeze or fawn. These intensified reactions are passed on because they were necessary for survival in an adverse situation. Adaptive responses become dysfunction responses and dysregulation with the level of threat becomes minimal but the behavior stays the same.

The Bishop used his body analogy not just for individual souls and bodies but for families and communities too. Across time patterns persist in families and communities even when the individual members change. Some patterns continue to be adaptive while others become maladaptive. Churches are no exception.

My favorite illustration of this truth is the movie Encanto. Like many Disney movies La Familia Madrigal has trauma in their history. Unlike Bambi, the trauma in this family is not revealed up front. As in real families it is hidden away and revealed over time. The Madrigal Familia is full of exceptionally gifted people with exaggerated abilities. At the same time there is one family member no one is allowed to talk about, Bruno. Secrets are covered up with a surface story of achievement and exceptionalism. I will let you watch the movie before revealing more! (Hopefully we can watch the movie at Church and discuss it!)

As the wonderful book "The Body Keeps the Score" illustrates perfectly, our individual bodies and our corporate bodies carry forward what the past has impressed on us. Part of our interim work is to reflect on the body of St. Luke's across time to see how our corporate body has been formed for good and for ill. We will do this work at two congregational meetings this Fall and I hope you will attend. Look for an opportunity to watch Encanto too! (If this topic interests you I also recommend the book, "My Grandmother's Hands.")
