



Online Banking

Bill Pay – with online bill pay, you add St. Luke's Church as a payee, enter our address of 99 Peirce St. East Greenwich, RI 02818 and schedule your payment.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use online bill pay, then you are familiar with making payments this way. You can schedule single payments or set up regular payments in advance.

No cost to you or the Church



Zelle Transfer

Zelle Payment – with Zelle payment transfer, you can add St. Luke's Church by using the giving@stlukeseg.org address.

Benefits: Ease of use – if you already use Zelle, then you are familiar with making payments this way. This only makes one payment at a time, so you will have to initiate each payment.

No cost to you or the Church



PayPal and VANCO Payment Solutions

PayPal and VANCO Payments – With PayPal and VANCO payments, you create your individual accounts on their sites, set up how you want to pay, and the funds are deposited in the Church's account

Benefits: If you like points or miles, then these are your sites! They are the only options that accept credit cards. Like Online Banking, you can set up recurring payments or make single payments.

Transaction Fees for the Church



Direct Payment From IRA

Direct Transfer – If you are 70½ or older, you can instruct your IRA provider to make a Qualified Charitable Distribution directly from your IRA.

Benefits: Any funds paid this way are not reported as taxable income to you. You can make your entire yearly pledge with one payment, help satisfy your required distribution, and incur no tax on the income.

September	2024 YTD	Budget	Var.	Ann. Budget
Total Income	\$565,350	\$510,338	\$55,012	\$721,925

Total Expenses	\$563,909	\$594,707	(\$30,798)	\$788,483
Net Income	(\$1441)	(\$84,370)	\$85,811	(\$66,558)

Notes:

- Income continues to outpace the budget with pledge income \$45K ahead of budget. I join the leadership and thanking each of you for your continued, timely support! (Yes, I think you are all amazing!)
- Expenses are pretty much on budget at this point we have some property expenses coming up that will hit in the 4th quarter.

My favorite discovery is a sign board that had been affixed to the doors of the original church, which states:

To all who are young and need counsel; to all who are strong and want a taks; to all who are weary and need rest; to all who are lonely and want companionship; to all who mourn and need comfort; to all who are grateful and want to give thanks; to all who are sinful and need a Saviour – to whosoever will; this Church opens wide its doors and in the name of Christ our Lord says – WELCOME.

What a lovely statement of generous welcome! To me, this says our church is alive with God's relational availability and we want you to experience God's welcome here, from us! To me, this explains my experience of St. Luke's as a genuinely welcoming community.

When I served as Rector at St. Mary's in the suburb of Chicago called Park Ridge, we had a formal greeting

program and an organic greeting program. The organic program boiled down to one wonderful, faithful woman named Jeanne Marshall. Along with her husband Stew, Jeanne sat near the back so she could exercise her charism for welcoming visitors and newcomers. A member of the church for 30+ years, she could spot a newcomer by the opening collect and make a beeline to them at the passing of the peace. After the dismissal she would warmly welcome them in the aisle and escort them to coffee in the Library Lounge.

If you asked any group of newcomers who they met first at St. Mary's, they would always say Jeanne Marshall. We are blessed at St. Luke's to have a number of 'organic greeters' who extend a warm welcome to newcomers. Please feel free to join in if you have this particular charisma from God!
